CONSERVING THE RACE

New Prison Treatment Economic of Citizens
Col. Clark in responding to the toast, "Canada," at the annual dinner of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association said that while in the past Canada had been profligate of its great assets, the problem of conservation was being taken up and that the idea of conservation included the men, women and children, living and working in Canada. The speaker asserted that the new idea in treating prisoners and criminals was that every prisoner was not a criminal and that every criminal was not a prisoner. In connection with this idea he spoke of the Quebec prison farm, where men are given a fresh start.

Careful But Lose
That the fruit growers who take the best care of their orchards will be the heaviest losers on account of the damage to the fruit crop, was logically explained by Prof. W. T. Macoun of Ottawa at the convention of the growers of the Niagara district, the opening session of which was held at Grimsby. The progressive grower who cultivated and pruned for fruit development, cutting back the wood, assisted in the early advance of the buds brought on by the unusually mild weather of the early winter, which was followed by an unprecedented season of zero weather which killed the premature buds.

The bull carcass was sold for one hundred dollars to a party of hunters from Ohio, who shipped it home, and no doubt have told some tall stories since of their prowess in the wilds of northern Canada. Paderewski, the famous pianist, has become a nervous wreck owing to the numerous threats to kill him which have been made by the notorious Black Hand Society in America. He is one of the most heavily-insured men in the world. His right hand alone is insured for \$50,000. On one occasion he split a fingernail badly and, in consequence, could not play for some days. He got \$5,000 from an insurance company. Paderewski once listened to an ambitious girl's playing. "She must be very charitable," was his comment. "Surely she leteth not her left hand know what her right hand doeth." On several occasions, after his recitals at Queen's Hall, London, the pianist was "mobbed" by admirers—chiefly ladies. The same thing happened in America. In Boston he had a tooth extracted. A wealthy widow made the highest bid, and the prize now dangles as a charm—set in gold—from her watch chain.
