Local and Provincial Items of Interest.

Gleaned By 'Guardian' Reporters and Correspondents.

News Budget of Happenings Round About the District.

THE mail train arrived last night at 10.50.

Mrs. J. G. CAMERON, left yesterday to visit friends in Nova Scotia.

REFERRING to the announcement of the opening of Kindergarten and Primary school, we call attention to the fact that Miss Sayre, the accomplished director of the Kindergarten, has during the holidays taken a post graduate course at "Martha's Vineyard Summer Institute," in the following subjects:— Kindergarten, Primary Methods, Child-study and Pedagogy. Miss Sayre brings to her work an increased knowledge, and if possible a deeper interest in the work of the school. Mrs. McPherson, whose work last year was so satisfactory to the Board and patrons, takes again the position of Assistant in the Kindergarten. The Primary school is under the efficient and pains-taking management of Miss Lena Barrett, a licensed teacher, and last year the work was most satisfactory. We trust that this important institution will receive from the citizens the support it certainly deserves.

EASTERN ITEMS.—Not much improvement in fishing since my last; a few catches of mackerel at different parts, but no great quantity. Some eight or nine vessels constitute the whole fleet around here at present.—poor representatives of the hundreds that resorted to these waters before the advent of seining, before our fish were destroyed.—The wheat is badly damaged by the continued wet weather, the acreage around here is much larger than usual.—Rev. Mr. Simpson began his pastorate under favorable auspices at the South Lake Christian Church on Sunday the 14th inst.—Rev. J.A. Ford of Eastport, Maine, preached in his native church, the East Point Baptist church, to a large and appreciative congregation. Rev. E. A. McPhee, the pastor of this church, enjoys the proud distinction of being the only native preaching to a Baptist congregation on the Island. I believe the same rule holds good among the other evangelical churches on the Island, the native Island preachers being in a minority. While in natural ability, in intellectual acquirements, in theological lore, in abstruse philosophy, the peers of any, while filling pulpits in every province of the Dominion, and in the United States—filling them with distinguished ability, with credit to themselves and native land—our pulpits are filled by men from the other provinces, and good men too. Why this exchange? Is it for the reason given long ago—that a prophet had no honor in his own country?—I am informed that some one of a very telescopic and lively imagination has written to a contemporary paper imputing motives to your correspondent, and extracting meanings from a former communication to your paper that the language would not convey. I do not hold myself accountable for construction ignorance or prejudice would put on my words, and would relegate him, her or them to the care of some of our third class teachers for instruction in our English language.
