Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family of any rank over eighteen years of age, who has resided for a certain period in any part of the Dominion of Canada, Saskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must apply in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after having homesteaded patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homesteaded patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homesteaded right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$1.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

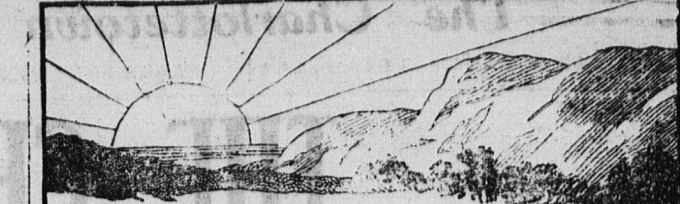

CHARLOTTETOWN BOY'S RISE IN ROYAL NAVY

Lieut. William S. Gordon, Son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Gordon, Now a Full-Fledged Naval Officer With the Fighting Fleet.

Many friends in this city will be interested to learn that Mr. William S. Gordon, son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Gordon of this city is making rapid advancement in the Royal Navy. He will be remembered that Mr. Gordon entered the famous Greenwich Naval College where he graduated with high honors making a total of 96 per cent in his examinations. The result was that he was immediately called to service in the Grand Fleet with the rank of Lieutenant. This fleet is composed of the principal fighting ships of the Navy, patrolling the North Sea. The Commander of the ship to which Lieut. Gordon was attached, the name of which is withheld on account of censorship regulations, made him the choice of 400 officers recommended to the Admiralty. He has since taken a special course at Devonport, the great British Naval arsenal and is now on sea "Somewhere in the North Sea."

A friend in England writing to Lieut. Gordon's father from London under date of April 10th said: "You know of course of your boy's success. He is an honor to his parents and the Island. He is now a full-fledged Naval Officer, an honor which the Admiralty has bestowed on very few. At the present time he is at Devonport taking a special course, after which he will go to sea in one of the largest ships."

Lieut. Gordon is a seaman by instinct and has had a remarkable career for so young a man. When he was a mere boy he went to sea and studied navigation. He made voyages to practically every part of the world. He made the famous voyage with the late Jack London, the noted novelist, when he wrote his story entitled "The Mutiny of the Elsinore," which had such a remarkable run in Hearst's Magazine. Mr. Gordon went half round the world at that time on a four-masted barque to gather the material for the book and wrote a large part of it on the voyage.

Lieut. Gordon was also five months in China during the height of the revolution there some years ago and was also a spectator at the great Durbar in India when King George was crowned. He was also blockaded during the Turco-Italian war having many unique experiences.

Thus the Admiralty took into very favorable consideration Lieut. Gordon's extensive experiences at sea and his thorough knowledge of the technical side of navigation is very evident.
