at his back and upheld his work during the month past, will express a due recognition of his valuable service by extending his term with an increase of his well-earned salary.

THE WINTER STEAMERS.

At the present writing (Saturday afternoon) the Steamer Minto has been ice-bound in Picton harbor for nearly a week, while passengers, very anxious to cross to the Island, are awaiting her release. Among those thus detained are Premier Peters and his colleagues, returning from the Provincial Conference at Ottawa, and other prominent citizens. Meanwhile the Stanley is still adrift in an ice-pan in the straits, having been out of regular service for almost four weeks. The ice-boat service at the Capes has also experienced unusual difficulties and delays, so that we are still without mails from the mainland since those brought by the Minto a week ago. It is right that correspondents on the mainland should know, as they will when they peruse these facts what causes the delay in the receipt of and reply to their favors.

We do not think that adequate effort has been made to release the Stanley from her imprisonment and serious peril, although since the Minto has been shut in it is difficult to say just what could have been done. The situation is and has been such as to bring into bold relief the great difficulties which beset our winter service and the urgent need of equipping the Capes Route at the earliest possible moment. For it is to be observed that had both the winter steamers during the week past been on the eastern route neither one could have effected a crossing there. When the Minto could not get out of Picton Harbor it is safe to say that the Stanley could not have got into that harbor had she been free to have made the attempt.

The Legislature of New Brunswick has been dissolved and a general election ordered the polling to take place on 28th February.

The Mayor and Town Council of Digby, N. S., who resigned because of the arbitrary and illegal conduct of the Salaried Magistrate have been triumphantly re-elected. This is a rebuke to the provincial Government who refused to dismiss the Magistrate when requested to do so by the Mayor and Council.

WANTS JURIES IN COURT TRIALS.

SIR.—As this is the age of progress, the people of Queens Co. as well as King's and Prince Counties seem to be fully alive to the necessity of having an Act put upon our local Statutes, to enable any plaintiff or defendant at issue before any of the County Court Judges or Salaried Magistrates including Justices of the Peace to have the privilege of a jury if they considered it necessary. Such juries to be paid by and optional to either party at such tribunal.

As it would appear that such a privilege could do no harm and certainly would be a matter of equal rights to all, and would have a tendency to lessen litigation and save in a great measure the expense of an appeal from the lower courts to the Supreme, and as there are a number of petitions for said purpose with already several hundred names there, to be presented to the people's representatives in Parliament, it is suggested that if you would kindly please to give publicity to the foregoing brief remarks in an early issue of your influential and independent journal, with any comments or suggestions so that the public would have an opportunity to discuss the matter so that the age of progression more and more be promoted and developed at home as well as abroad.
