Stanway who was such an indefatigable worker on behalf of our boys overseas during the late war, passed away rather suddenly yesterday afternoon. She had been about as usual on the previous day but yesterday afternoon she complained of feeling as well as usual and as she rested, her spirit quietly passed to Him who gave it. Though never enjoying robust health, Miss Stanway was possessed of a wonderfully bright and energetic disposition as all will testify who had come to know her through her various activities in the way of administering to the comforts of the lads overseas. As Secretary-Treasurer of the 106th Comfort Circle she performed a noble work which will never be forgotten by hundreds of our soldiers who had to endure the hardships of the trenches and brave the other dangers of war fare. She had two brothers overseas, one of whom, William, made the great sacrifice. The other, George, who was quartermaster with the 106th and has been absent from the province since the war, is now on his way home. To the bereaved parents and surviving brother, deepest sympathy is extended.
