MENU FOR SUNDAY. Breakfast: Oranges, Cornmeal Porridge. Dinner: Mashed Potatoes, Turnips, Lemon Jelly. Tea. Celery. Cake: Bread, Tea. Jam. Baked Apples. Supper: Tomato Scallop. Oatmeal Muffins. Tea. Baked Hominny and Cheese. The recipe for Baked Hominny and Cheese and Oatmeal Muffins, mentioned above, are as follows:— 1 tablespoon of oleomargarine or drippings, 1 tablespoon cornstarch or 2 tablespoons flour, 1 cup milk, 1/2 teaspoon paprika, 1/2 cup grated cheese, 2 cups cooked hominy, 1/2 cup breadcrumbs. Make a white sauce of the fat, cornstarch or flour, salt and milk. Add the cheese and paprika to the sauce, arrange the hominy in baking dish and pour the sauce over it. Cover with crumbs and bake 20 minutes in a moderate oven. MENU FOR MONDAY. Breakfast: Oatmeal Porridge. Dinner: Buckwheat Pancakes, Tea or Coffee. Syrup. Cream of Vegetable Soup, Baked Hominny and Cheese, Potatoes, Cabbage. Oatmeal Muffins: 1 cup cooked oatmeal, 1/2 cup flour, 4 teaspoons baking powder, 2 tablespoons sugar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 egg, 2 tablespoons melted butter. Mix and sift flour, sugar, salt and
