O'Hara Associated Press Financial Writer NEW YORK, June 23—(AP)—Bullish interpretations of the German-Russian war outbreak today touched off one of the fastest early stock market rallies in more than a year but the sprint soon lost momentum and initial gains of 1 to 4 points were substantially cut at the close. Dealings totalled 754,140 shares, largest turnover since June 10. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks held a net advance of 4 of a point at 41.8. It also was the day's best gain since June 10. New year's highs were posted for Standard Oil (N.J.), Texas Corp., Western Union and Savage Arms. Prominent on the upside were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Anaconda, American Telephone, Chrysler, Douglas Aircraft, Santa Fe, Du Pont, J. I. Case, Union Carbide and Allied Chemical. Near the close a block of 21,369 shares of Commonwealth and Southern common came out at 3-8, off 1-16 of a point.

Livestock

MONTREAL, June 23—(CP)—The Dominion livestock branch reported today that hogs and calves were higher on the two Montreal markets. Cattle and lambs were easier. Early sales of cattle were mostly cows at prices that seemed 25 cents lower for good and up to 50 cents lower for medium kinds. Good cows made from \$6.75 to \$7.25, medium \$5.50 to \$6.50 and common \$4.75 to \$5.50. Canners and cutlers were \$3.50 to \$4.25. There were not enough early sales of steers to establish prices. Receipts were: cattle 1,121; calves 1,378; sheep 555; hogs 546. Calves were steady to 25 cents higher than the close of last week. Veals were unchanged at \$7.50 to \$10 with a few at \$10.50 and one up to \$11. Medium kinds \$9 to \$9.50 with commoner kinds selling mostly between \$7.50 and \$8.25. Drinkers gained 25 cents ranging from \$5.25 to \$7 and averaging close to \$6.50. Grassers were \$4 to \$5. Lambs were easier on the better kind. Good quality lambs were \$13 with culls selling from \$10 to \$11. Sheep were from \$3.50 to \$7 and selling mostly in mixed lots at a round \$6. There was a stronger feeling on the hog market and there were no early sales made at time of writing. On July 1st, the markets will be closed to all trading.
