### Presbyterian Stipend Start Asked At \$2,000

TORONTO, June 8—Minimum salary for ministers should be raised above \$2,000 a year, the 74th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Canada recommended Friday. Present minimum wage is \$1,900.

This decision came after a committee under Rev. A. N. Miller of Brampton, Ont., had studied the scale of stipends.

Rev. John McNab of Kitchener, Ont., was unanimously appointed editor of the church's official publication, The Record. He had been acting editor for the last two years.

### Standing Offer

OTTAWA—If any member of the House of Commons can get enough milk from a cow to produce \$1.50 worth of butter, Joseph O. Gour (L—Russell) is willing to give him "the cow, the pail, the bench on which you sit, the milk and the barn, too."

He made this standing offer in the House of Commons recently during the resumed debate on the bill to end the oleo-margarine ban, introduced by James Sinclair (L—Vancouver North).

The Liberal M.P. who spoke in French, said that he had recently had a visit from a friend who complained about the high cost of butter.

He said that he had proffered the following challenge to determine if the complaint were well-founded: "Your wages will be \$1.50 an hour, with three weeks holidays with pay, and time off with pay for sickness. I will order my chauffeur to drive you to a good farm owned by one of my nephews and if you are able to milk enough milk in one hour to produce \$1.50 of butter value, I will give you the cow, the pail, the bench on which you sit, the milk, and the barn, too."

Said Mr. Gour: "He refused the offer and I now make it to any honorable member of this House." There didn't seem to be any takers here either.
