NEW PROCESS HARDENS METAL

BUTTE, Mont., Sept. 1. (U.P.)—Milady need not worry about the jewel in the ring on her finger slipping from the prongs if the metal alloy worked out in the laboratories of Montana state school of mines is a success.

Metalurgists at the school have formulated a hardening process which they believe will enable jewelers to harden the more precious metals without destroying beauty. The research workers already have

successfully hardened copper through a precipitation process with the addition of about two per cent of nickel silicide. The resulting alloy was nearly twice as strong as structural steel, but still retained the essential characteristics of copper.

The copper hardened in this manner showed extraordinary ability to take the most delicate casting and machining.

Workers in Dr. Curtis L. Wilson's department believed that the same principle could be applied to gold, silver and other of the more rare metals and make them strong as well as beautiful.
