

THE MAINE CLAIMS.

THE LAW IN OPERATION.

Although there has been a great reduction in the amount of liquor sold and a notable decrease of drunkenness on the streets there is reason to believe that some illegal sales have been made in secret within the City since the Prohibition Act came into force. We learn that informations have been laid and summonses have been issued returnable early next week. This brings us face to face with the attempt of the City Council to block the operation of the Act by forbidding the Police to take any part in the enforcement.

Let us assume that the Marshal and his staff of Police should each and all refuse to serve the papers issued by the Stipendiary Magistrate, and when the day of trial comes it is found that the plain duty of serving the summons has been neglected or refused. What then would be the plain duty of the Magistrate? He holds the responsible position of control of the Police and he holds the power of dismissal. Could the refusal to serve his papers be tolerated by the Magistrate?

We are of opinion that upon taking thought the Marshal and Police will conclude that the only prudent course for them to pursue is to carry out the duty to which they are sworn and to serve the papers and carry out the instructions that may be placed in their hands emanating from the Stipendiary. If they do this they will be clearly in the line of their duty and in the line of greatest safety as well, for to refuse would be to invite dismissal, and to make dismissal not only justifiable but imperative.

We have no information whatever as to the Stipendiary's intentions, not having spoken with him or the subject. But to take an ordinary, common-sense view of the situation, it would appear incredible that a Magistrate holding the power of dismissal could willingly permit the officers of his court to defy his authority, refuse obedience and treat with contempt the processes and mandates issued by him. It may be said, and is said by the opponents of the law, that if a policeman were dismissed by the Magistrate he could be re-appointed by the Council. Even in such case the disobedient policeman's lot would hardly be "a happy one." On his re-appointment he would be just where he was before and unless he decided to obey the Magistrate he would quickly find himself dismissed again. The Stipendiary is on duty every day. The Council only sits at intervals and can only make appointments during its regular or special sessions.

These suppositions are only to show that if both parties did their worst the dismissals could follow as rapidly and with greater facility than appointments could be made. It is easy to see that such a course would lead to the utter demoralisation of the police force and to general chaos. We thus produce the line of possibilities in order to show that the course of opposition to the law as laid down by the Council is one that is unsound, impolitic and incapable of being carried out. At the same time we trust we have made it clear that the Marshal and Policemen will find it to be alike in the line of their interest and duty to obey the Stipendiary Magistrate.

THE STREET LIGHTING CONTRACT

THE GUARDIAN'S reference to the action of the majority of the City Council was hardly fair to the four Councillors who expressed themselves as opposed to City leasing the Royal plant. While we think that the lower and quite reasonable tender of the Full Company ought to have been promptly accepted and this was not done, it is to be observed that Councillors Lyons, Tanton and Kelly ap-

pear to have expressed themselves in favor of accepting it. Councillor Horne was not in favor of leasing the "old plant". In so expressing themselves the four Councillors came—one half the Council—were quite right right and no doubt in accord with the true interests of the City and of popular sentiment as well.

But we cannot think they performed their whole duty when they allowed the matter to stand over without a division that would have placed every Councillor on record. It is as well that all should understand that the present situation is one in which an indignant public will not consent to any further juggling. The clear duty of the Council is to lose no time in accepting the Full Company's tender and so give the City a creditable light at a fair price. No other course is decently open, and the sooner the end of the discreditable tactics too long pursued in regard to the lighting contract are terminated the better.

Even the Examiner finds it proper to say, "Of course the City Council will, as in duty and honor bound, accept the lowest tender in this case."

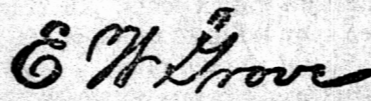
