The adjourned window breaking case was resumed before Stipendiary McQuarrie yesterday morning. Harry Harvey, Joseph Richards, John Arbing, James Houghton and Secord Cook were examined.

The prisoner was then asked if he had anything to say.
He answered, "I have no evidence and, am not guilty."
The Stipendiary then referred to the evidence and considered it sufficient to send the prisoner up to the Supreme Court for trial. The prisoner was committed for trial at the next sitting of the Supreme Court.

The Stipendiary made reference to the evidence of policeman McDonald and John Arbing, and was surprised at the officer's ignorance of the affair, and surprised that he was not to be found at the time.

He also made reference to the cowardly and disreputable pieces of vandalism which have been perpetrated in the town and which should be hounded out of the country. While the clerk was writing the commitment papers the prisoner made a rush for the door but was seized by officer Henderson. When being taken to jail he attempted to break away from the officers and his wife interfered but he afterwards went along quietly and was lodged in jail. McCourt, one of the witnesses was ordered to give a recognizance to appear at the trial.
