STOCK MARKET CLOSED STRONG

Absence of Further Liquidity Caused Bears to Cover in Haste.

NEW YORK, Feb. 15.—The principal fact imparted by the action of the stock market yesterday was its lapse, in large part into the hands of the professional element. The element had been impressed on Friday with assertions put in circulation regarding the contents of President Taft's speech, then in prospect for Saturday. These assertions lent a color of leniency to the supposed views of the president on the corporation problem which aroused the fear amongst bearish speculators that that subject was to be converted into a factor for booming stocks rather than a cause for anxiety to corporation interests. The perusal of the speech disclosed no sign of the retractions which had been broadly insinuated in some of Friday's reports, and the professional operators in stocks promptly retraced the steps they had taken on Friday. This was the cause of the marking back of prices from one to over two points in the opening transactions in stocks. At the level there proved to be no active pressure to sell stocks and, on the contrary, the kind of demand developed which halted the decline early last week.

The sustaining effect on prices and the scanty offerings of stocks caused fresh intimidation to the bear party and they sought to cover with increasing urgency. The end of the day saw the severe declines of the opening replaced by substantial net gains, with prices rising. The shrinkage in the volume of the day's transactions demonstrated the small selling pressure at any of the day's price levels. The bulk of the day's business was done in the first and last hours.

Foreign markets had held Friday's price level for American stocks better than was done when the New York stock market opened. The consequence was a substantial volume of buying orders for execution on arbitrage here. This helped the recovery, which set in promptly after the opening break. Imports of merchandise continue very heavy, in spite of the shrinkage in exports compelled by the high prices of cotton and wheat.

ISAACS HELD ON ABDUCTION CHARGES.

SHERBROOKE, Que., Feb. 15.—In the Court of King's Bench on Saturday Judge Milvena bound R. D. Isaacs, of St. John, N. B., over to the next term of the Court of King's Bench, on a charge of abduction. The complaint was laid by J. Rheault, Mayor of D'Israeli, and the charge was that the accused had abducted the daughter of the complainant under a promise of marriage. The accused, who is connected with the D'Israeli Asbestos Company, is said to have taken the girl in question first to Boston and then to New York. At the latter place the girl stated that she went through a form of marriage with the accused before a Catholic priest, but she learned afterwards the man who performed the ceremony was a Protestant. It was also alleged that the accused had a wife and family in St. John, N. B. He was allowed his liberty on furnishing two bail bonds of \$2,000 each.

HIGH PRICES FOR CALGARY LAND.

CALGARY, Feb. 15.—What is probably Canada's record sale of lots took place here on Saturday, when 150 lots were thrown on the market by the Canadian Pacific Railway and were sold for prices ranging from \$500 to \$600. The lots were all disposed of within twenty minutes. The total realized was about \$75,000.
