TORONTO, Aug. 22 — (CP) — Price movements were irregular in today's Toronto exchange market. Volume was the heaviest of the week at 173,000 shares.

Active selling of Preston on a price drop to 23 was a feature of the last hour. The price recovered to 3.10 a few minutes before the close for a net loss of 5 cents. Interest also was concentrated in Duquesne and 52,000 shares of that stock changed hands with the price firming 1-2 to 11 3/4. Kerr-Addison, Mining Corporation, Pioneer, East Malartic and Toburn closed narrowly higher and MacLeod, Lock-shutt, Nipissing, O'Brien, Pamour, Powell, Rouyn, Teck Hughes and Upper Canada were down. Base metals were stronger on the improved showing made by Smelters, Falconbridge, Sudbury Basin and Denison Nickel. Steep Rock sold down 4 cents to 1.78. Gains of a point or more were made by the group of International Milling pfd, Canadian Wirebond Box, Hamilton Theatres pfd, International Metals A pfd, Maple Leaf Gardens pfd, and Tamblyn's. Maple Leaf Milling common was active and up 1/4 at the close. Bell Telephone, Laura Secord and Walkers common added small fractions. Home Oil was the most active of the western oil group and it touched 2.44 before subsiding to 2.37 for a net gain of 2 cents. Pothills firmed 4 1/2 to 65 and Anglo-Canadian weakened 2 cents to 58.
