EASTER CANDY EGG FAMINE AVERTED

BOSTON, March 7.—The threatened scarcity in the supply of Easter candy eggs this year has been averted by the loss of the suit of the United States government against the big candy manufacturers of the country. Therefore the little ones may be made happy during the forthcoming holidays by presents of the time-honored Easter candy egg. The government contended that the use of tale in any manner in the manufacture of foodstuffs is a violation of the Pure Food Act. Candy manufacturers have been using tale to give a high polish to the candy eggs, and the government claimed that this was an adulteration within the meaning of the act. Judge Frederic Dodge, in the United States District Court, ruled against the government and instructed the jury to return a verdict for the defendants, unless it found the evidence showed there was enough tale in the candy to constitute an appreciable part of the sweetstuff. The jury decided that there was no violation of the law, and rendered a verdict in favor of the candy manufacturers.
