A PERPETUAL PEACE PACT IS HINTED

Geneva Hears Japan is Ready to Approach United States.

NAVAL LIMITATION British Yielding on Washington Standards and no Change Expected.

GENEVA, June 25.—Overtures by Japan with a view to the signing of a perpetual peace treaty with the United States are looked for in authoritative circles of the tripartite naval conference.

U. S. Coal Miners To Strike July 1

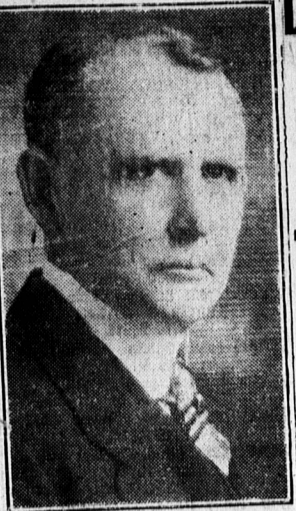
