REV. NEIL HERMAN SAYS THE CHURCH SHOULD NOT BE USED AS A POLITICAL FOOTBALL

Before a Crowded Congregation he eloquently Scores Against Bootleg Methods on the Part of Those Who Cry Down the Illegal Trafficker in Whiskey and Rum.

The following is a synopsis of the excellent sermon preached last night by Rev. Neil Herman, B. A., at the Central Christian Church to an overflowing audience whose interest he held during the entire course of his sermon.

BOOTLEGGING—WET AND DRY.

Text: Rev. 22: "For without are dogs, and sorcerers, and whoremongers, and murderers, and idolaters, and whosoever loveth and maketh a lie."

The mere mention of "bootleg" and everybody cries "whiskey." It is difficult to separate the idea of whiskey from the word "bootleg." But "bootleg" and "bootlegging" are words that carry a bigger and wider meaning than mere intoxicating liquors.

We say "bootleg" and a thought other than whiskey leaps into our mental machinery.

The plain, unvarnished, everyday truth is this—bootlegging is a mentality; bootlegging is a method; bootlegging is a habit of thought and action. Bootlegging will, some day, be incorporated into our language as one of the most potent and suggestive words known in the English tongue.

We have come to the time when bootlegging is both wet and dry. Let us face bootlegging in the light of a new meaning. It is time to watch the dry bootlegger, and get a focus on the tricks and machinery of a business, that is playing hide and seek with the people, and everything else, that counts in human life and destiny.

A Concoction of Lies.

What is bootleg whiskey? It is a concoction of lies. It is for the most part a deadly dope made up of ingredients that carry with it suspicion, pretreatment, degradation, and, in many cases, insanity and death. It is this vile, modern compound, seeping through our social life, everywhere, that we must fight and fight, until this brand of poison is a thing of the past.

Nations and governments as well as individuals and families are up against this demon that snags chains and fetters as did the man of Gadara in the days of the miracle working Christ.

And what can be worse? Let me tell you. When you bring down from the devil's laboratory that in great knowledge by the name of ignorance; when you take the elements of lust, intemperance, prejudice, spite and unbelief, and compound them and put them into the bottle of human thought, you have a bootleg composition, that from the standpoint of delirium and death, exceeds the latest, the last and the worst of the most dangerous bootlegger in this country or any other.

And the man or the party or the organization, who commercializes the weaknesses, the frailties, the sins and the tragedies of human nature, is a bootlegger of such horrible proportions, that to be seen is to be despised and condemned. To put the bottle of such a death-dealing concoction to one's neighbor's lips for the sake of filthy lucre is about the last ditch of human depravity.

And he who drinks from such a bottle is a fool of the first magnitude. The bootlegger, whether wet or dry, starts with a lie; he builds up a lie; he mixes a lie; and the last end of such a man is a lie. And between the wet stuff and the dry stuff—damnable as both are—the choice of preference must in

Mr. MacLure's ten-minute address into office in 1923 to face a depleted treasury, a road policy which had been stopped abruptly immediately after the election, leaving all public thoroughfares in an unfinished and dangerous condition.

Taxes Reduced.

When the Stewart Government returned to power for another term of office there will be further relief of taxes, especially for the farmers and the working men with families. We can promise you that there will be a very considerable reduction in the Income Tax so that the working man will be in a better position to make ends meet. After all, the ideal country to live in is the one with the lowest taxes, for taxation not only fails to stimulate but saps it at its foundation, and it should be the endeavor of every Government worthy of the name, and it will be the endeavor of the Stewart Government to make the conditions of life as easy and as pleasant as possible for the farmers, the laborers and the industrial members of the community.

Compare the Records.

Compare briefly the record of the Stewart Government with that of the Bell Government which preceded it. The Conservative Government went out of office in 1919 largely because they had pledged themselves to take advantage of the Dominion Government road grant, and to pursue an improved road policy. The Liberals, then in Opposition, denounced that policy as iniquitous, ruinous, and likely to drive the farmer into bankruptcy. They so frightened and alarmed the many of the electors throughout the country that they voted against the Conservative Government and put in power the Bell Government. You all know what happened between 1919 and 1923. The Bell Government adopted the road policy of the Arsenault Government which they had so severely condemned. They pursued an extravagant policy which very nearly brought about the financial ruin of the Province, instead of fulfilling their platform promises and pledges, they did almost the direct opposite, until the people put an end to their mismanagement in July, 1923. They had promised to reduce taxation; to run the country on its present revenue. Instead of that they resorted to a policy of extreme taxation, described by themselves as a policy of "taxing everything tangible and intangible."
