Kate went to Spokane on a visit to her parents during the summer of 1890, and returned to the Northland two months later. Back in Dawson, the whole town turned out to give their Kate a royal welcome.

"You'd think I was the Queen of Sheba, the hand the people gave me. They kept milling about and shouting my name the minute I came into view."

"Jonny had been the first to grasp my hand. Perhaps the boys thought he held it a bit too long, for suddenly an angry shout went up from the crowd: 'Break away there, everybody! Break away and let our Kate pass along!'"

That night Dawson celebrated as it had never celebrated before. All that was good and bad blended together in one hectic spree that still is discussed whenever a group of sourdoughs come together.

The winter of '99-1900 was almost an exact replica of '98, and yet there was this difference: an absence of faces that used to be so familiar. Some of these had made their pile and left, some had drifted to other camps.

"This is no place for me," he told her. "I'm heading back to my little shanty. I've had enough of this place to last me the rest of my days."

Klondike Kate was running a nursing home at Bend, Oregon, when she received a letter from Jonny Mattson. This was the beginning of a correspondence which lasted many years and resulted in one of the strangest marriages in record.

On the 1902, the pair met for the first time since the hectic days of the gold rush. It was Christmas Eve. The place, Vancouver, British Columbia.

"I've always loved you, Kate," said Jonny as the two strolled about lovely Stanley Park. "But I never could muster enough courage to tell you when we were in Dawson. We seemed to be so far apart then."

Kate and Jonny were married in Vancouver July 14, 1933, thirty-one years after Jonny had popped the question. They never lived together, for right after the wedding Kate returned to Bend while Jonny went back to his claim, one hundred miles from Dawson.
