Scout News and Notices

The lot of little boys who are learning how to live is sometimes very hard. I know of one case at the time that seems inevitable so. This is the case of a boy who is just finished being a Cub and has now to begin all over again and by a Scout. He is the leader of his pack. He has gathered honor after honor in that capacity. His little khaki shirt is covered with all kinds of badges, tokens of his efficiency.

Now these have all to be stripped off and I very much fear that unless his mother buys him another little khaki shirt, he will be going about looking very patchy, rather like a wall on which pictures have hung for many months and which betrays, by its unfaded portions of paper, just exactly where the pictures have hung.

From being a big frog in a little pond, he has now to become once again a little frog in a big pond. This kind of experience comes to us all several times in the course of our lives. We are, from time to time, all called to go into new worlds. Progressing or retiring, we are always being put into the position of being greenhorns, tenderfoots.

"For" as a wise man once said, "we brought nothing into this world and it is certain that we can carry nothing out." "Naked shall man return, and shall take nothing of his labor, which he may carry away in his hand." This is largely true of us when leave any one of our many worlds and enter another.

Yet it is not altogether true that "Our birth is but a sleep and a forgetting." The Soul that rises with us, our life's Star, Hath had elsewhere its setting And cometh from afar. Not in entire forgetfulness And not in utter nakedness, But trailing clouds of glory do we come From God who is our home."

We can always carry something into the new world with us. Our trappings, our badges, may be temporary. A good Cub is a potentially good Scout; but he has to learn to be a good Scout. He must forget the old badges and begin collecting all over again.

It is all a little hard. We feel complete strangers. I fancy, when we are first placed in a cradle in this new world; we are strangers again when we creep; again when we walk; again when we first enter the world of sickness; again when we go to kindergarten, again in the preparatory school. . . . and so on.

We have to change the size of ourselves like Alice in Wonderland, when she ate the mushroom. We are too big and then we become exceedingly small. We have to cast our skins over and over again.

It is a little humiliating, of course. To be a big shot one day and to be a very small fry the next; to be all covered with badges one day, and then to be as bare of badges as a tree in winter is bare of leaves—it is a great discipline, a salutary experience; but it is not altogether pleasant. It is rather like taking medicine.

But it is necessary to take your medicine and the more you can smile about it, the easier it is to swallow. It is well, too, to learn how to do it when we are very young, because sooner or later—and quite often—we have to learn to step down and begin all over again.

A Cub's cooking may be all right for a Cub; but it is not expert enough for a Scout. His ability as a craftsman of any kind may be excellent for a little boy; but it is not of that high standard that is expected of his elders. We all have to keep learning, and we are fools if we do not, not only because we do not learn enough, but also because we have not seen the necessity of continuing our education.

NEW PRINCIPAL OF MCGILL INDUCTED

Colorful Series of Ceremonies As A. E. Morgan, M.A., Takes Over Office.

(By H. M. Peters Canadian Press Staff Writer) MONTREAL, Oct. 6.—Arthur Eustace Morgan, M. A., today was officially started on his new career as seventh principal and vice-chancellor of McGill University. He was inducted into office yesterday and welcomed to the University in a colorful series of ceremonies such as Old McGill had not seen in many years.

Solemn induction in the morning was followed by a reception and lunch at the McGill Union. Then the principal saw his University team win its initial start of the 1935 intercollegiate football season. Later in the afternoon he witnessed the Canadian Grenadier Guards, resident in scarlet uniforms, mount guard over the grave of James Wolfe at the foot of the garrison. In the evening was a banquet at a banquet attended by hundreds of members of the Graduates' Society from Canada and the United States.

Representatives of state, church and universities from all Canada greeted the new principal. More than 20 universities and colleges from Halifax to Vancouver sent their president, principals or leading members of their faculties to form a brilliant background to the morning ceremony when Mr. Morgan received the gold fringed robe of office as successor to the late Sir Arthur Currie.

Climax of the ceremony came when Professor Morgan took off his blue hood of Master of Arts and his gown, and received MCGILL'S gold decorated gown from the hands of Dr. F. D. Adams, emeritus vice-principal.

Welcome to the University was expressed by Sir Edward Beatty, Chancellor, on behalf of the Governor General, C. F. Martin, Dean of the Faculty of Medicine, on behalf of the faculty, Hollie McHugh, president of the student's society, on behalf of the students and Dr. H. P. Whidden, Chancellor of McMaster University, Hamilton, in his capacity as vice-president of the national conference of Canadian universities.
