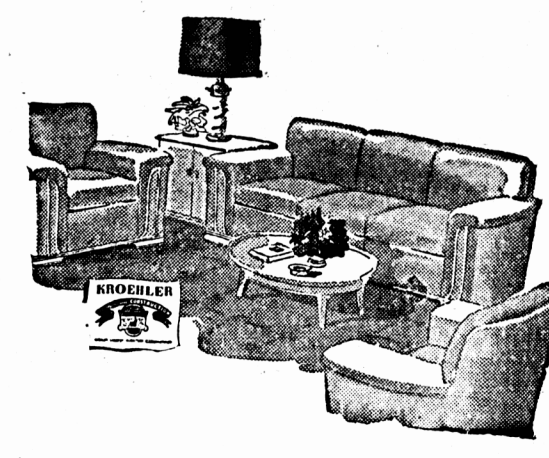

MUSIC AND ROMANCE BLEND IN "NIGHT SONG" -The absorbing romance of a needy young blind composer and a wealthy society girl is dramatically developed in the John Cromwell production "Night Song" for RKO.

Co-starring Dana Andrews, Merle Oberon and Ethel Barrymore, the picture blends the creation of a brilliant new concerto with an unusual type of love story. Andrews portrays the composer, who becomes embittered when he loses his sight in an automobile accident. Miss Oberon plays the sympathetic socialite who recognizes his talents and strives to have him resume his career.

Her unique methods of gaining her end, and the striking climax that is reached when the composer's concerto is played by Arturo Rubinstein and the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra under Eugene Ormandy, give the picture a spectacular climax. Hoagy Carmichael heads the supporting cast, with Leith Stevens writing the Concerto in C Minor around which the picture centers.

Parking Meters Arrive In S'ide The parking meters which are to be installed on Water Street, Summerside, have arrived and will be set in place as soon as the representative of the Jones Electric Co. Ltd. arrives from Halifax. At the same time it is understood that the white lines marking the parking lanes will be changed. The new lines recently put down are a 45 degree angle from the curb and it has been found that parking at this angle makes vehicles project too far into the centre of the street. It would be a suitable angle for a wider street and would enable more cars to be parked. But it has been found unsuitable for Water Street and the old type of lanes will be revived. The meters will be installed for a trial period and if not satisfactory will be removed. It is understood that a period of probably a month will be set aside at the beginning when no summonses will be issued for violations of the new regulations regarding the meters so that the people can become accustomed to them. -S.
