GLACE BAY MOURN DEATH OF JACK CASEY

GLACE BAY, January 16.—"Jack Casey is dead." It is on all lips in Glace Bay tonight. His friends—and he had hosts of them—have read the news with shocked regret, for "Jack" Casey was more than a mere citizen; he was an institution in this country that breeds men who go down into deep pits and seem to take unto themselves some of the rich, potent quality of the coal they mine.
Officially he was John Casey, manager of the Caledonia colliery, one of the Dominion Coal Company, one of the collieries situated within the corporation limits of the town of Glace Bay, and one of the oldest mines in the province—a mine with a wealth of history behind it. But his "boys," as he called the people of Cape Breton, he will always be remembered as "Jack" Casey, a man whose rise in the business of coal mining was admirable, as it was marked.
Of him a friend wrote this a few days ago:
"Jack Casey is the manager of Caledonia, and a popular manager. He was born at Caledonia, and never worked anywhere else. I believe he cut his front teeth on a piece of Caledonia coal; and has been absenting his big system every day since until he is today a living, breathing coal mine in himself. He loves Caledonia and the Caledonia boys and they all love "Jack." No man did more during the war to help the boys; to help the folks, and to "keep the home fires burning." No man received more letters from France, and no man kept in better touch with the boys. When they came back he put them to work, and if he didn't have a "place" for them he made one. The big bosses have offered Manager Casey other jobs, but he won't shift; he has made a reputation at Caledonia for Caledonia and for his helpers, and he prefers to stay out. He is Irish, married, and a sport promoter."
Manager Casey was a son of Thomas Casey, of Caledonia Mines, a Caledonia miner of the old school, respected alike for his sterling citizenship and his coal mining abilities. The son followed in the footsteps of the father, and knew coal mining from bankhead to pit-bottom.

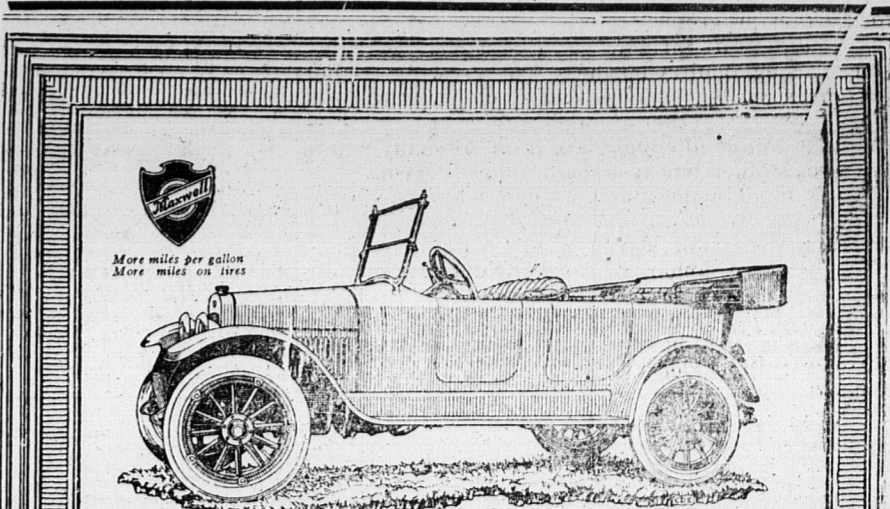
