## VETERAN OF CIVIL WAR IS DEAD IN DIGBY.

DIGBY, N. S., Aug. 30.—Frank A. Braman of Boston, a veteran of the civil war, died at his home in Digby

tonight, aged 75 years. He is survived by his widow, formerly Miss Meade, of this city.

The deceased was born in Boston, Sept. 10, 1835, the son of Jarvis Braman, the late proprietor of Braman's Baths, Boston, and was the last survivor of the family. Educated at the Boston Grammar School, he later secured the position of inspector of weights and measures. After the outbreak of the war Mr. Braman resigned his office and on Sept. 9, 1861, enlisted for three years in company F., 24th Massachusetts Volunteers infantry under Colonel, afterwards Brigadier General, Stephenson, and was with Burnside's forces.

In 1870 Mr. Braman came to Nova Scotia for the benefit of his health and was so attracted by Digby's charms that he settled here. His home, 'Hillside Hall,' is beautifully situated overlooking Digby Basin. He soon became one of the best known and most popular men in the town and his death will be much regretted by all his acquaintances.

## SIXTEEN STRIKING RIOTERS SENTENCED TO IMPRISONMENT.

NEW BEDFORD, Sept. 1.—Sixteen of the eighteen strikers, who were arrested last Friday in connection with the riot at the Sharp mill, were found guilty of riot when arraigned before Judge Milliken in the local court today, and each was sentenced to three months imprisonment in the house of correction. All appealed and will carry their cases higher. The other two were found not guilty and were discharged by the court.
