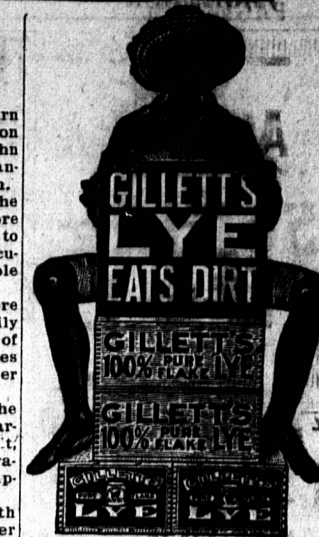

P. E. I. Nurse Weds Rich Fairbanks MISS ANNA LOUISE McLEAN IS BRIDE OF BOSTON MIL- LIONAIRE.

BOSTON, May 11.—Charles F. Fairbanks, millionaire gladiolli cultivator of Lexington, has married his nurse, who was Miss Anna Louise McLean, and moved his entire 25 acres of gladiolli from Lexington to Florida.

It is learned that the marriage took place at St. Petersburg, Fla., on April 25, at "Passadena," a magnificent estate which Mr. Fairbanks has established there.

The marriage comes after a romance which commenced several years ago when Miss McLean, who is a graduate of the Boston City Hospital and well known in the nursing fraternity, was nursing her present husband's father, the late Charles Francis Fairbanks of Milton, who was head of the Bigelow Carpet Company, vice-president of the Warren Institution of Savings in Charlestown, a director of the Second National Bank of Boston and active in the affairs of a dozen other companies.

For the last six years Miss McLean has been private nurse to Mr. Fairbanks at Cary Farm, his magnificent estate at Lexington, where, though there as a nurse, Miss McLean was really the director of the estate and handled the details of everything connected with it.
