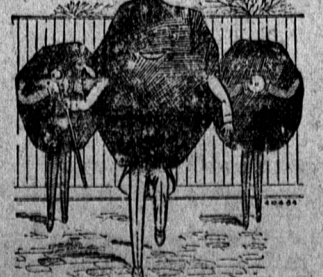

GENERAL ASSEMBLY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Now in Session at Woodstock Ont. Church Union Will Be One of the Subjects Discussed

A correspondent at Woodstock, Ontario, sends the Guardian the following report of the opening there on the 3rd inst., of the Grand Assembly of the Presbyterian Church of Canada.

The 40th meeting of the General Assembly opened last evening with a splendid practical address by the retiring Moderator, Rev. Dr. McKenzie the Church's most prominent Honan Missionary. He made an urgent appeal for more men and more money for the work in Canada and in the foreign field.

The service was held in Knox Church, a beautiful new edifice and ornament to a city which had already been very much enhanced by the superb buildings and outstanding buildings being the Law Courts which include one very much of some of the best architecture of the Old Country. The church was filled to overflowing and the whole service was very impressive. A very pleasing effect was contributed by the choir in their black gowns and trenchers.

There were nominated for the Moderator's chair five leading ministers of the church, any one of whom would have performed the duties with ability and presided over the meetings of the court with grace and dignity. The selection was, however, narrowed down to two men, Dr. Herdridge of Ottawa and Dr. McLeod of Carrie. The former having secured the majority was declared elected. As was to be expected Dr. Herdridge in a few choice and chaste words thanked the Assembly for conferring upon him the highest office in its gift.

This will be one of the most important assemblies ever held in connection with the Presbyterian Church in Canada. There are many very important questions to be discussed but they will all pale into comparative insignificance for the time being before that of the Union of the churches.

The prevalent feeling is that there should be delay as the church does not seem to be ready for the consummation of union however much some may desire it. The personnel of the Assembly is very striking. The older men appeal to all as men of fine scholarship, good judgment and excellent spirit. The younger men make one feel that while they have in measure all the foregoing qualities, they also have vigor of mind, breadth of vision and strength of purpose which clearly indicate that the Presbyterian Church may well rely on her interests being well advanced in coming years.

It speaks well for the future of the Dominion that so many bright, courageous, intellectual young men have devoted themselves to the moral and spiritual well being of the country. The Mayor of Woodstock welcomed the Assembly in the name of the city in a very eloquent address and the Moderator in a masterly way made a most fitting and appropriate reply. One of the most prominent elders here is Mr. T. C. James of Charlottetown.

WOODSTOCK, June 5.—The style of entertainment by the people of Woodstock is on a colossal scale, and the Commissioners were met at the railway station by automobiles. Automobiles are in evidence at the desks of every sedentary to convey the delegates to their respective locations in the city. The Rev. Mr. Herdridge makes an ideal presiding officer and has won the admiration of all the members of the court.

The Church is about to issue a new book of praise and to make it as effective as possible the Rev. Mr. McMillan was appointed to look after the work and to advance the interest of the members in all congregations. A work entitled "Aids to Devotion" is about to be issued by the Assembly and no doubt will be highly appreciated by the people, and especially by those in the thinly populated districts of this great country.

The Committee on statistics reported as follows: Number of families, 173,687; number of communicants, 314,832; contributed for all purposes, \$768,484; average of giving per family, \$33.20 for all purposes; per communicant, \$14.31. Including Women's Missionary Societies, the grand total for all work at home and abroad was \$1,319,360. The evening was devoted to Home Missions. East and West, when rousing speeches were made by Dr. McKinnon of Halifax and Superintendent Grant, of Western section. All are waiting eagerly and anxiously for the Union debate, which is expected to come on tomorrow morning.
