### CANADA'S PAVILION AT PANAMA EXPOSITION FORMALLY OPENED.

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 25.—Canada's pavilion at the Panama Pacific Exposition was formally opened to the public today, after dedicatory ceremonies attended by a large number of persons, including many British subjects.

The Dominion was represented by Martin Burrell, Canadian Minister of Agriculture. In his address Mr. Burrell read the following cablegram from Sir Louis Hargrove, British Secretary of State for Colonial Affairs, conveying a message from King George:

"I am intrusted with a message of good will and congratulations from our august Sovereign to the Panama Pacific International Exposition."

"The King feels that there is no doubt that this great undertaking will be attended with great success and prove worthy of the vast accomplishment which it celebrates."

"His Majesty rejoices to think that his Dominion of Canada is taking part in this exhibition, thus testifying to the appreciation of the British Empire at the linking of the Atlantic and Pacific and at the happy results which may be expected from the mingling of the waters of the two oceans."

"At the conclusion of Mr. Burrell's address, 'God Save the King' and the 'Star Spangled Banner' were played."

### KAISER IS NOW ON THE FRENCH THRONE

CAIRO, Feb. 26.—The Press Bureau, which the Germans have established at Constantinople, appears to be spending its time in telling the Turks the story of the great war in the style of "The Arabian Nights."

According to the Journal Terjiman Askari, an Asia Minor publication, the Kaiser has already kept his self-made appointment to meet the Parisians in Paris. This newspaper says on the authority of the Constantinople Press Bureau:—  
"The discourse delivered by His Imperial Majesty Wilhelm II., when installed on the throne in the ancient French Parliament, will live as an unforgettable record of his magnificent exploits. Surrounded by his vanquished foes, he offered his imperial hand to be kissed by all the former deputies of the French Chamber, whose hearts were touched by the splendid magnanimity of His Islamic Majesty."

Adrianople appears to have witnessed the greatest air feat of the war, for the newspaper Sabah, which is frank enough to state that all the news comes by "radio-telegraph" from the German Press Bureau, tells this weird tale:—  
"Twenty five Zeppelins have arrived at Adrianople, bringing to their destination the first Turkish army corps. We believe these soldiers of Osman will inflict a crushing defeat on the infidels."

If we are to believe the journal called the Hanumiah Ghazette, the Turkish capital's spring season will open with a tremendous sensation. Under the heading "Court News" that paper publishes this piece of startling news:—  
"The harem of His Imperial Islamic Majesty Wilhelm II. and the harems of the officers of his staff will arrive at Constantinople at the beginning of the spring. Six of the most powerful dreadnoughts which have been captured from the British will escort the Imperial harem."

### CANADIANS CLAIMS TO BE SETTLED BY THE END OF MARCH.

LONDON Feb. 26.—It is expected the Canadian claimants on the Empress of Ireland's Manistow House fund will begin to get a settlement of their claims by the end of March.

This statement was made by the public trustee today. The complaint has been made that, although the English claims had been settled since the closing of the fund in the latter part of 1914, Canadians were being kept waiting.

### DACIA IS NOW APPROACHING THE ENGLISH CHANNEL

NEW YORK.—The steamship Dacia, which sailed from Norfolk, February 11 for Rotterdam with cotton, in the face of assertions that she would be seized by British warships inasmuch as she had been a German vessel at the outbreak of the war, had at

most completed her trip across the Atlantic without interference on February 23, according to messages received here today. These messages asserted that the Dacia was 400 miles west of Lands End, England, on that date and would proceed through the English channel to Rotterdam if not taken.

### SARAH BERNHARDT IS NOW MAKING SATISFACTORY PROGRESS.

BORDEAUX, France, February 26.—The bulletin issued today concerning the condition of Sarah Bernhardt, whose leg was amputated on Monday, says that she passed a good night and continues to make satisfactory progress. Mme. Bernhardt said this morning that not for many years had she passed a night without suffering until after the operation, but that she had been able to sleep peacefully during the last three nights.
