Sees U. S. Facing Early Choice In French Indo-China

The bell is tolling in French Indo-China.

The United States soon may be forced to make a most uncomfortable choice about that unfamiliar but important country in Southeast Asia.

The choice threatens to boil down to this:

Either help the French keep their protegee regime going under Emperor Bao Dai, or see his rival, Communist Ho Chi-Minh, take over the country with the political if not the military help of Red China.

There seems to be no time for any other alternative to be worked out. Ho's Nationalist guerrillas attacked this week near Hano in a surge of activity that included sabotaging the city's electric plant.

To back the French in Indo-China threatens to hold even more disastrous political possibilities in Southeast Asia than backing Chiang Kai-Shek had in China.

Chiang's Government was recognised and had existed for years. The French-sponsored republic of Viet Nam under Bao Dai was set up less than a year ago and not even the French have ratified Bao's status as Emperor.

Recently they have conferred more upon him, so that on paper they retain control of only defence and foreign affairs. But against this is the fact that Bao's rival, Ho Chi-Minh, heads a flourishing guerrilla republic (also called Viet Nam) which controls far more of the country and the people.

For three years the French have tried to keep Ho off the railroads, the main roads, and the big towns by using an estimated 120,000 French Foreign Legionnaires. Ho has the rest of this war-torn country so well in hand that the French supply some of their advanced outposts by air drop.

Time is running out on this picture because the Chinese Reds were set up less than a year ago and now have their army along the northern border. Ahead of them a total of 32,000 fleeing Nationalist troops poured into Indo-China. The French have had to intern these and it puts another strain on their resources.

When the Chinese Red Army reached the border Communist political influence came into play. Up to that time, Ho Chi-Minh had headed a Nationalist coalition government in which he and his Communists were supposed to be a minority. Then early in December there were unconfirmed reports from Saigon, the big southern city, that he was purging the non-Communists from his government.

This unconfirmed but ominous sign has been followed by recognition of Ho Chi-Minh's republic of Viet Nam by the Chinese Reds themselves.

Nobody recognizes Bao Dai's Viet Nam, which exists only because the French have set it up and kept it going.

The question of recognition brings up another unconfirmed

Canadian Bacon For Britain

The Rt. Hon. James G. Gardiner, Minister of Agriculture, announced January 3, that a Bacon Agreement had been negotiated with the United Kingdom which provides for an expenditure of \$17,500,000 for the purchase of Canadian bacon at a price of \$29 per hundred pounds. A grade Wilshire's, i.o.b. Canadian seaboard. As announced on December 23, the Meat Board has been authorized to pay a price of \$32.50 per hundred pounds of bacon, the difference of \$3.50 per hundred pounds between the buying price of \$32.50 and the price of \$29 at which the bacon is sold to the United Kingdom will be met from funds provided by the Government of Canada. The total quantity of bacon which may be purchased under the terms of this Agreement will approximate 60 million pounds. The Canadian Government is meeting the request of the United Kingdom Ministry of Food regarding the storage of some portion of the bacon purchased during the early part of the year, to be shipped during the latter part of the year. Some time following June 31, 1950 existing export controls on hogs and pork products may be removed. Meantime consideration will be given to applications for export permits for bacon to be shipped to markets other than Great Britain. The subsidy of \$3.50 per hundred pounds will be discontinued on and after July 1, 1950.

report which circulated recently in Washington.

It said that the French tried to swap their recognition of Red China for recognition of Bao Dai. At the same time they sought British recognition for Bao Dai, in return for going along with the British Government in recognizing Red China.

Supporting evidence for this report is the suddenness with which the British Government recently cooled off on Bao Dai. Formerly Britain was reported ready to recognize him. The supposition is that the Chinese Reds warned Britain to lay off Bao Dai, that the Red finger was on him and that Britain would do well not to back him.
