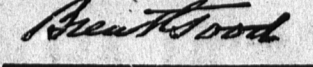

### Proposed Union Of Baptist Churches

The question of a union of the Baptist and Central Christian congregations in this city has been discussed for some time past. Last evening in the respective churches meetings were held with the object of definitely ascertaining the views of the respective congregations.

In the Baptist Church, with Mr. A. W. Sterns as chairman and a large and representative congregation present, a resolution was adopted commending the principle of union and looking confidently forward to its ultimate consummation, but expressing the conviction that such union was not feasible at present.

In the Central Christian Church, there was also a large and representative gathering. Mr. Samuel Kennedy presided. All the speakers expressed the opinion that the proposed union would enhance the usefulness of both congregations, but owing to the unavoidable absence of several members of the congregation, and in order to give all an opportunity of further considering the question, definite action was postponed to an adjourned meeting to be held on April 12th.

Following is the basis of union agreed upon by a joint committee of both congregations and for consideration of which last night's meetings were held:

- (1) We agree to unite our congregations by holding the regular Sunday preaching services in the larger church building on Prince Street (hereafter called the "Immanuel Church"). The smaller church building on Kent Street can be used for united prayer and social services and Sunday School work as mutually agreed upon in the best interests of the cause of Christ.
- (2) We agree to unite our funds for the support of the local church and also for missionary and beneficent purposes along existing channels now used by both bodies—the best methods of collecting and distributing same to be left in the hands of a united financial committee to be appointed.
- (3) It is desirable to unite our Young People's Unions, Women's Missionary Aid Societies and Sunday Schools and to co-operate as heartily as possible in carrying out the aims of these most important branches of Church activity; we therefore agree to unite in each of these departments of church work and suggest that, as soon as the union is agreed upon, the present officers of these societies or organizations resign and new officers be appointed by the united societies or organizations.
- (4) A united Trustee Board of members shall also be appointed in conformity with the statute bearing upon this matter.
- (5) In addition to the name "Immanuel Church" by which designation the united body shall be known, the words, "United Baptist and Disciple" may be used upon the sign board of church and the words shall also become part of the name of the United body in deeds of conveyance or writings affecting the title of the property held by the said body.
- (6) Seven Deacons shall be appointed by the United Body whose duties shall be those designated by the teaching of the New Testament. These shall constitute a Board of Deacons who, together with the pastor, or minister, shall have supervision over the spiritual interests of the

### Safe Arrival of Socks

The following letter has been received by Mrs. Robert Kaneen, President of the Red Cross Society, St. Peter's Bay from Mary Plummer, Lieutenant of the Canadian Field Comforts Commission, Shorncliffe, England.

Dear Madam:—The box of socks mentioned in your letter of January the 3rd, reached us quite safely, and we are very much obliged to you for them. Two boxes addressed to G. R. Kaneen (a son of Mrs. Kaneen) also came the other day and has been forwarded to him. I hope you will hear from him of their safe arrival. We can get shirts here a great deal cheaper than you can in Canada. They cost only three shillings and nine pence (94 cents) each. If you care to send us money we will spend it for you in any way you wish, and forward the articles to any man or battalion that you will mention. Socks are always wanted. Church and give advice or assistance in adjusting any difference in practice or church polity that may arise. It is suggested that Deacons be appointed for a term of three years when they shall be eligible for reelection. On the death or removal of any member of this Board, another shall be appointed at a regular meeting of the Church, notice of same having been given from the pulpit of the Church two weeks previous.

(7) The qualifications for membership in the united Church shall be as follows:—The Church is composed of baptized believers only. Candidates are accepted for baptism on a public profession of their faith in Christ and may be received into the local Church by a vote of the members and receiving the right hand of fellowship.

(8) The ordinance of the Lord's Supper will be observed on the first day of the week, and the privileges of Communion extended to all members of Christian Churches.

(9) In choosing a pastor, it is mutually agreed that only men whose sympathies with union are well-known and who will consent to support the principles upon which the two bodies have entered into union will be considered eligible.

(10) We unanimously commend to all our brethren and sisters in the Baptist Church and the Central Christian Church of Charlottetown the foregoing suggested basis of union, believing that a true and sincere union of our Churches would be for the glory of God and the extension of His Kingdom on earth.
