### HONORED BY THE KING



Four officers of the service of the Canadian National Steamships were included in the list of honors awards to personnel of the Merchant Navy in the King's New Year's Honor list, according to an announcement made by the Federal Department of Transport.

Two members of the C.N.S. personnel, Captain Pierre LeBray Scott and Chief Engineer George William Watts, both of Halifax, were made Officers of the British Empire (O.B.E.) while two other officers, purser Robert John Kerr of Halifax and Chief Engineer Archibald MacArthur of Montreal became members of the Civil Division of the Order of the British Empire (M.B.E.).

1. Captain Scott, O.B.E., has been with the Canadian National Steamships for twenty years and since the outbreak of war has served in many fields of operations. He is now master of "Victoria Park," managed and operated by C.N.S.

2. George William Watts, O.B.E., was born in England and has been with the C.N.S. since 1928, serving in various engineering capacities including that of chief engineer on the "Lady Nelson," Canada's senior hospital ship. He is now chief engineer of the "Lady Rodney" in Army Transport Service.

3. Purser Robert John Kerr, M.B.E., is a native of the "Lady Rodney" is a native of Cobourg, Ont. He began his C.N.S. service with the Ontario Car Ferry Company in 1927 and transferred to the company's West Indies service eleven years later. Award citations for Officers Scott, Watts and Kerr read: "for long, continued, faithful and arduous duty while serving at sea during this war, two years of which were in submarine infested waters."

4. Archibald MacArthur, M.B.E., now Chief Engineer of C.N.S. "Colborne" was born in Glasgow, Scotland, and joined the Canadian National Steamships in 1923 serving on ships operating to the West Indies. The citation in his award reads: "for brave conduct in the face of the enemy." His ship sustained a thirty minute enemy aircraft attack which dropped bombs around the ship and machine-gunned the decks. Three bombs were effective but none hit directly and although most of the crew had been ordered to the boats he stuck to his post throughout the attack.

### Editors Seek Free Press For France

PARIS, Jan. 30 — (CP) — French editors and government officials want complete freedom of the press in France after the war and hope to set up a co-operative news agency to accomplish that aim, the committee of representatives of the American Society of Newspaper Editors reported today.

"The whole press and government stand for what we in America stand for," said Wilbur Forrest, assistant editor of the New York Herald Tribune, spokesman for the committee.

### Name Director Of Family Allowance Set-Up For Canada

OTTAWA, Jan. 30 — (CP) — Wing Cndr. R. Byrnes Curry, 40, deputy chairman of the Canadian Legion National Education Committee, has been appointed director of the Government's new family allowance organization, it was learned today.

Wing Cndr. Curry was released by the R.C.A.F. last September to take the position with the Legion. A member of the Nova Scotia War Association he makes his home at Kentville, N.S., but has devoted most of his life to education. Holding degrees from Acadia University, Harvard University and the University of London, England, he was for a time principal of schools at Fugwash and River Herbert, N.S., and before entering the R.C.A.F. was inspector of Nova Scotia high schools.

### Londoners Coal Supply Reduced

LONDON, Jan. 31 — (CP) — Shivering Londoners, experiencing one of the coldest winters in a century, were told tonight they would have to get along on one quarter of a ton of coal and possibly less for each family during February.

The Ministry of Fuel said those with as much as 400 pounds of coal on hand at the beginning of the month would get no more.

The Government also urged the public to reduce consumption of gas and electricity in order to avoid restrictions on war industries.

### PROTECT FAMOUS MOUNTAIN

CAPE TOWN — (CP) — The slope of Table Mountain will shortly be safeguarded from soil erosion through the recovery work done with Dunn's finger grass which was found some years ago at Mt. Nyathila, in Uganda. The important slopes of the Table Mountain area will be planted with this grass.
