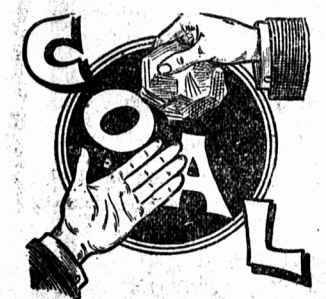

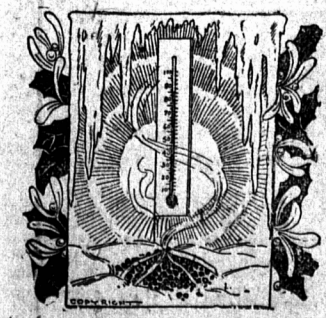

LONDON "BOBBY" DIES ON POINT DUTY.

LONDON, Eng., Jan. 27.—For the first time in the history of London, a policeman was killed on point duty. Londoners so thoroughly appreciate the services of the constables directing the traffic of the metropolis that the news created a sensation. G. John Smith was the victim, and the scene was Ludgate Circus. Smith was run over by a motor bus, the front wheel passing over his head. An eye-witness said the vehicle skidded with the wheels locked as though on ice runners. The streets were very greasy. Twelve metropolitan police were injured by the horse-drawn vehicles, and 22 by motor vehicles while directing traffic in 1912.

MORE WAR TALK FROM ULSTER.

NEW YORK, Jan. 27.—A cable from London to the Tribune says:—According to news from Londonderry, preparations on a military basis are going on all over Ulster, with a view to resistance to any Dublin parliament, by an armed and disciplined force. Such reports however must be taken side by side with the fact that the pending by-election fight in Londonderry will be one of the closest in the history of the borough. Friday next is the polling day.

STUDENTS DRIVEN FROM BEDS IN DORMITORY FIRE.

SARACUSE, N. Y., Jan. 25.—One hundred and seventy-five students at Callanan Hall, the men's dormitory of Cazenovia Seminary, made hurried escapes when the hall was burned today. Eddie Hall, a dormitory immediately adjoining was endangered. One hundred young women all of whom were asleep when the fire broke out, were ordered into the street and were not given time to dress.

HIGH RATS DISTURB SLUMBERING JURORS.

WILKESBARRE, Pa., Jan. 25.—A small army of cats and a generous supply of rat traps were today ordered installed in the jury room of the \$2,000,000 Luzerne County courthouse, following the howl of protest set up this morning by jurors doing duty in a murder trial over the presence there of a multitude of rats ("big as cats").
