## TUNNEL FINANCES SHOWING THE GAIN

To the Dominion by Constructing this Work as Detailed by George E. Full at the Meeting of Delegates in Market Hall March 10th.

(Concluded)  
Oats—The large quantities of oats used in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick at least all that go by steamer and rail have to be bagged, put into cars then handled into the steamers, then out again into cars on the other side. All this means loss and expense for labor and bags. I venture to say that if our merchants could load oats in bulk into the cars in the towns and in the country and ship them direct without handling and without the expense and trouble of bagging that they could afford to pay on an average three cents per bushel more to the farmers than at present.

Potatoes—This is one of the most profitable crops. Unfortunately as we are now situated the shipping season is confined to two or three weeks in the fall and spring, and when the crop is large, every market is flooded and prices fall below profitable business. In all shipments made by steamers or railroads the potatoes have to be bagged and handled two or three times, into and out of cars and steamers, causing injury and expense. Under conditions such as the tunnel would give with the properly heated cars, all markets would be open for 12 months in the year, the business would be reliable and profitable, and potatoes would bring at least five cents per bushel on an average more than under present conditions.

Eggs, Butter and Cheese—Three great staples that need careful handling and proper temperatures would immediately increase in value as all markets would be available with all necessary shipping facilities.

The annual increase in value of Farm Products would be about as follows:  
Hogs 50,000 at \$2.00 each \$100,000  
Oats 5 m. bus. raised and sold each year, about 3 1/2 million bus. at 100,000  
Potatoes 5 m. bus. raised could be sold each good year, 2 to 3 m. bus. at 4c. 100,000  
Cattle 20,000 raised for sale at 2.50 50,000  
Sheep 40,000 raised for sale at 50c 20,000  
Eggs 2 m. doz. for sale at 2c. 40,000  
Cheese 4 m. lbs. for sale at 1 20,000

Butter 800,000 lbs. for sale at 2 1/2 20,000  
All other farm produce say 20,000  
Increased value of farm products per year FISHERIES \$170,000  
Total value \$800,000  
Oysters \$80,000. Lobsters \$400,000.  
Smelts \$20,000. Allow for increased value of all.  
Fresh fish with facilities for shipping at all seasons, say \$80,000  
In smelts alone the value of them exported per year will probably reach \$100,000

So then this Province would be \$550,000 better off each year if the Dominion Government had fulfilled their bond and built the tunnel. In addition to all this is the plain fact that if our young men had remained on the Island instead of moving out West as thousands have done and had have put their intelligence and energy into the best method of farming—the annual products for export could have been doubled; anyone at all familiar with the capabilities of the soil in P. E. I. will attest to this fact.

The value of the farms in this Province as taken in the census of 1901 is about \$30,000,000, that of the town and village property about \$6,000,000, \$36,000,000 in all. If the Dominion Government had kept their bond of union and built the tunnel 20 years ago the value of the above properties today would be \$50,000,000. If we are not given this proper shipping facility population of this Province will go on decreasing until there will be hundreds of untitled farms. And the value of the land will be merely nominal. So that it is not too much to say that the Dominion Government is liable to this Province for every year we are without the tunnel, between one and two million dollars, and that the construction of the tunnel would increase the value of property in this Province to the amount of \$10,000,000 to \$15,000,000.

### PRAIRIE FIRE.

ELLENDALE, N. D., March 10.—The most destructive prairie fire which has visited this section in years has just swept past this place. Starting 18 miles west of here, it travelled with tremendous speed straight for the town, but before it reached here the wind veered and carried the fire south. Many thousands tons of hay have been destroyed and thousands of head of stock have been burned to death.
