THE fishermen in Sydney anxiously looking for bait state that the banks, a few miles from Sydney harbor are teeming with fish. All that is necessary for the greatest season's catch on record is a sufficient supply of bait. A few days ago a French fishing vessel, Notre Dame de la Garde put into harbor after a second supply of bait. She had been out fishing five days taking as her bait supply only fourteen barrels of herring secured from local fishermen. During that short period her eighteen fishermen landed five hundred quintals valued approximately at \$3000. Every other vessel that has been fishing bring in the same glowing reports.

WIDOW BURNING RENEWED AGAIN

LUCKNOW, May 11.—The stringent efforts of the authorities have not succeeded in stamping out suttee or widow burning.

According to Hindu custom a widow must immolate herself upon her late husband's funeral pyre and meet death by fire. Two cases of suttee have been brought to light within a month. A young Hindu widow at Cawnpore stole away from her home, saturated her clothes with kerosene and set fire to them in the heart of the civil station. She was found with her jaws bound as if for burial and at the point of death.

At the Punjab Court five men and a woman appealed against the judgment of the Sessions judge at Delhi who had sentenced them to ten years imprisonment for taking part in the immolation of a widow aged twenty.

The suttee was performed in the presence of a great crowd on the banks of the Jumna. Two village chiefs endeavored to dissuade the woman from her purpose, but she calmly mounted the funeral pyre, her relatives piling fuel around it.

Then, at her request, they gave her a lighted brand and she set the pile afire. Straw was strewn about the pyre and in due course the body of the widow was consumed. The ceremony lasted six hours.

The four relatives and the head men were arrested and admitted the main facts.

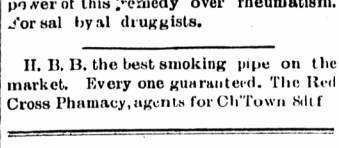
BULGARIAN BAND MASSACRES GREEKS.
