He was arraigned before the Magistrate and after confessing his crime, was sent up to the Supreme Court. He gave no reason for his actions, but realizes his position keenly. EMINENT MEN TO ATTEND FORESTRY CONVENTION

FREDERICTON, N. B., Feb. 9.—Among those who have signified their intention of attending the sessions of the Canadian Forestry Association Convention in Fredericton on Feb. 23 and 24, are Hon. Clifford Sifton, of Ottawa, who will explain the objects of the newly formed commission of conservation of which he is chairman. President Thomas Southworth, who was formerly Superintendent of Forestry for Ontario; Vice-President Senator Edwards, the well known lumberman of Ottawa; Hon. Jules Allard, Minister of Crown Lands for Quebec; Dr. W. C. J. Hall, Superintendent of the Bureau of Forestry, Quebec; Chancellor C. G. Jones and Professor Miller, of the University of New Brunswick; Prof. E. J. Zavitz, of Ontario Agricultural College, who has charge of waste land planting for that government; Dr. B. E. Fernow, who was for twelve years Chief Forester of the United States; W. R. Brown, secretary of the Forestry Commission of New Hampshire, and others.

SENATOR'S SUDDEN DEATH.
