—A very large concourse of people attended the funeral services of ex-Sheriff Wright, which were held in the Methodist Church, Summerside, yesterday afternoon, immediately after a brief service at the late residence of the deceased. Not only the prominent citizens of Summerside but Mr. Justice Hazard and many other visiting members of the bar attending the Supreme Court now in session were present. The local clergy were also in attendance. The choir rendered beautiful music. Rev. H. J. Fraser offered prayer and Rev. R. O. Moise read selections from the scripture. Rev. James Strothard, pastor of the deceased, delivered a very tender address. He paid a glowing tribute to the work of Mr. Wright as a man, a citizen and a public official. Mr. Wright ever wore the white flower of a blameless life. Not even the shadow or a shade of suspicion ever rested upon his administration of the many trusts committed to him. Mr. Strothard spoke of the richness and strength of Mr. Wright's religious life. In the last hour his faith never wavered. His religious exercises all bore the stamp of experience, of sincerity, simplicity and of hopefulness. As a friend he was as true as steel. He was a man of much intellect as well as of simple faith. The passing of such a man is an irreparable loss to the community and to the province. The burial took place at the family plot in Searl town.
