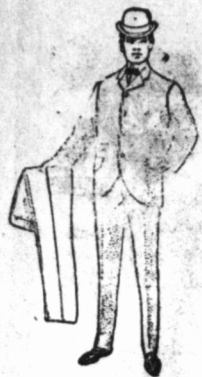

**COURT MINNEWAWA'S 20TH ANNIVERSARY**

The Independent Foresters of Bedeque Have a Splendid Time Celebrating The Anniversary of Their Court, -A Splendid Program Carried out.

The celebration in honor of the 20th anniversary of Court Minnewawa, No. 202, Independent Order of Foresters, at Bedeque on Friday evening last was a decided success. Although the night was dark and wet, with the roads very bad, the attendance of the members with their ladies and other invited friends was large. Every chair in the hall, which seats over two hundred, was occupied. L. W. Trueman, Vice-Chief Ranger, made an excellent chairman, opening the meeting with a brief but well worded address, consisting chiefly in description of the several anniversaries the Court has held. He expressed regret for the absence of the Chief Ranger, W. A. Leard, and of Brothers J. M. Clark, S. F. Hodgson, and Charles McDonald, who were prevented from being present on account of the weather and sickness. The audience was then favored with instrumental music, and a song by Thomas Moyse. J. U. Fowler who has been secretary for many years was called upon to give a history of the Court. Mr. Fowler had taken great pains to look up the inside work of the Court for the past twenty years and gave the history in a most interesting manner. It was very much enjoyed by those present. He stated that just twenty years ago the Court was organized, when there was only 214 Courts, with seven thousand members in the whole Order, and thirty thousand dollars in funds. Now the order can boast over five thousand Courts, two hundred and fifty-five thousand members, and ten and one half million dollars. Court Minnewawa of November, 1886, there were just ten beneficiary members. They were A. M. Wright, John Craig, W. A. Leard, Thomas Moyse, Charles G. Wright, J. Prince Leard, L. U. Fowler, Rev. E. C. Turner, Charles Bealstro, and Wellington Burns. The three last mentioned withdrew by cards and joined other Courts; the others are still members in good standing. During the twenty years seventy-two have been initiated, four joined by card, eight suspended, and three died. The names of the deceased members were Lawrence Godwin, Edwin P. Robins, and J. Marshall Wright. In referring to the sufficiency of the Order, Mr. Fowler said that when the Court was organized men who said they knew, gave the Order only ten years to live, but the ten men thought they would make the trial. The only regret of some of them now is that they had not taken large policies. During the twenty years those ten charter members have paid, in insurance fees alone, without interest, \$3,457, 0 which was only \$54.00 less than the whole Court had received in the twenty years. From the organization until April 1903 only seven meetings were held, and only three new members admitted. Then came a time of prosperity, or as the speaker put it, "A great revival" and twenty-five members were received in a few months. Since then regular meetings have been held, in all 185 in the twenty years, and new members initiated every year, there being now seventy in good standing, carrying \$70,000.00 of insurance. The speaker gave the average ages of the members and stated that boys who were not born when the Rev. S. C. Wells organized the Court twenty years ago were members tonight. The applause that Mr. Fowler received at the conclusion of his address was ample reward for the trouble he had taken to secure and give such interesting information. A recess was then taken to allow the people to get acquainted and the young ladies treated all to fruit and home made candy. The balance of the program consisted of gramophone selections, a reading by Miss Pearl Clark, several songs by John Mc-

Ivor whose pleasing manner and beautiful voice made him as popular in Bedeque as he is in Kinkora and elsewhere. A. Stirling McKay of Summerside, and Rev. George Steele gave excellent addresses. Mr. McKay at once placed himself on good terms with his hearers in the hits he made on members of the Court, then retreating to his seat he showed that the work the I. O. F. was doing was most unselfish and praiseworthy. Mr. Steele was really the most humorous speaker of the evening. He did not however neglect to give good advice to young men to begin habits of saving by insurance against sickness and death. Those anniversary meetings which have been held regularly during the past twelve years are very popular in Bedeque with the Foresters and their friends and the one held on Friday evening last was up to the average in every way.
