BIG SALES OF LAND.

TORONTO, Dec. 3.—Canadian Pacific railway land sales for the month of November amount to 27,000 acres for which \$85,090 was realized. This is a substantial increase over the showing made in October, when 17,000 acres were sold for \$56,000. The Northwest Land Company disposed of 6,920 acres during November, for which \$37,600 was paid. In October only 4,280 acres were sold for a total of \$22,500. Since the beginning of the year this company has realized \$364,316 for 68,115 acres sold, which is just about double the business done from January to November in 1897, when 33,700 acres had been sold for \$184,000.

TORONTO, Dec. 3.—And this, too, from Vienna, is suspicious. The Oesterreichisches Volksblatt states that the Holy See has withdrawn its countenance of the further sale in Austria of Protestant Bibles through the British and Foreign Bible Society. For upwards of thirty years the colportage of the Scriptures, though unlicensed by the diocesan authorities, has been permitted on a petition annually made by the Bible Society. The society has a depot in every town in the empire, and its operations in Austria of late years have been extensive. The Austrian Protestants are greatly agitated by the statement of Volksblatt.
