St. Lawrence Corporation slipped 2 1-4 points. Smelters and Vickers 1-2 and Abitibi Pfd and Royal Bank 1-4 each. Shawinigan Winnipeg and Weston held steady. Canadian Breweries and Imperial Oil posted gains of 1-8 each.

**Stock Prices Continue To Decline At N. Y.**

NEW YORK, April 9—(AP)—Rais and utilities gave up further ground in today's stock market, but the fast pace of Tuesday's liquidation was lacking and industrials were generally resistant.

A number of pivots held within extremely narrow limits. Selected favorites responded to special situation with modest upturns.

The President's cabinet meeting to discuss the price situation was followed closely in the financial section. Stocks largely ignored the statement that no plans of action were laid down at the meeting but commodities rallied after that development. Reports of improving coal operations and hopes for a telephone settlement were balanced by persisting concern over the labor outlook in steel and other industries.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite dipped .1 of a point to 63.7 where it was only .1 above the year's low New lows for 1947 were touched by the rail and utility averages. Total fractions of 850,000 shares compared with 1,020,000 Tuesday.

Distillers Seagram, which was up 1-8 among Canadian issues at mid-day, slipped in late trading and closed down 1-8. Other Canadian issues showed little change after noon. Canadian Pacific added 1-8 early and held its gain. Dome Mines closed down 1-8. On the curb, Lake Shore lost 1-4. Nickel Plate dropped to a new low at 26, off 2 1-2. Others lower included Schenley at 33, off 1 1-4. Santa Fe, Baltimore and Ohio, Texas Co., Standard Oil (NJ), North American, Electric Power and Light and U. S. Rubber.

Dividend declarations boosted United States lines 2 points to 21 1-2, a new 1947 high and St Paul preferred to 35, up 2 3-8. Pacific Western Oil added 1 7-8 and others improving included American Woolen, New York Central, U. S. Steel, Chrysler, Caterpillar Tractor, United Aircraft, Kennecott, Dow Chemical, Eastman Kodak and International Harvester.

**STALLION ENROLMENT**

According to the provisions of the Stallion Enrolment Act all stallions two years old and over, standing for service in this Province, must be enrolled in the records of the Department of Agriculture. Horses offering for service must be inspected and graded and carry an inspection certificate. Applications for enrolment and inspection should be made immediately.

Applications for enrolment should be accompanied with the required fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) and should include name of horse, breed, age, colour, description and Registration Number, if horse is registered.

Stallion owners who use horses for service not enrolled, or inspected or in grades not authorized by the Act will be subject to the penalty provisions of the above mentioned Act. Only horses enrolled, graded and authorized by the Department of Agriculture will be permitted to travel for public service. All horses that have graded "out" will not be permitted to stand or travel for service.

**Canadian Steel Output Climbing**

OTTAWA, April 9—(CP)—Output of Canadian steel mills in January advanced strongly, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today. Shipments of prismatic shapes during the month mounted to 268,313 tons from 228,981 in December, 246,547 in November, and 243,245 in January, 1946.

January shipments by tonnage included 50,482 tons of semi-finished shapes; structurals, 15,612; plates, 18,163; rails, 20,029; bars, 54,505; pipes and tubes, 12,406; wire rods, 24,220; black sheets, 21,903; galvanized sheets, 6,342; castings, 6,026; and tool steel, 559.

Of the month's shipments, 26,085 tons went direct to railways and railway car shops, 29,300 to building construction, 24,441 to merchant trade products, 14,898 tons to the containers industry, 14,279 tons to machinery plants, 11,171 tons to pressing, forming and stamping plants, 9,303 tons to the automotive industry, 8,320 tons to agricultural equipment, 7,127 tons to mining, lumbering, and related industries, and 5,508 tons to shipbuilding.
