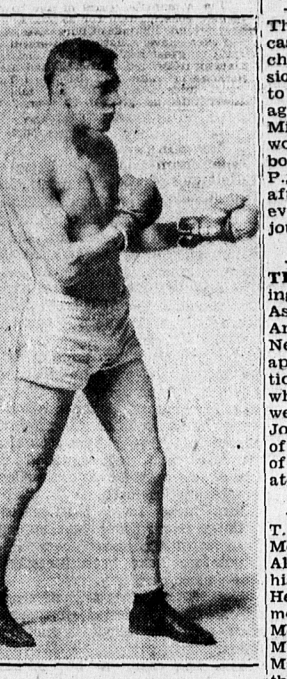

BRILLIANT WOMEN, BEAUTIES TO PASS.

NEW YORK, Sept. 29. - It will be a sad world in two or three centuries, for the present indications are that there will be practically no beautiful or brilliant women, wrote Professor Ellsworth Huntington, of Yale University, and Leon F. Whitney, executive secretary of the Eugenics Society of America, in a book, "The Builders of America," published today.

DUNBAR A NATIVE OF CANADA.

Washington naturally claims Uncle S. J. Dunbar, the well-known sculptor, whose death recently came with a shock to a great many people. That city has been his home for forty years and is full of the examples of his art. But, in reality, he was not only Canadian born, but first realized his power as an artist in Toronto, before he emigrated with his father to the United States.

Thousands of visitors to Toronto have gazed at the six Indian groups at the Royal Ontario Museum that Mr. Dunbar modelled. All over the continent, Mr. Dunbar's Indian groups are famous. Back in 1922, when he was modelling

one of them at the Ontario Museum, he told a reporter that he had done 150 Indians alone at Washington.

"I was nineteen, and had always lived on a farm near Waukegan, Ill., said Mr. Dunbar. "I had worked in the village and had done quarrying and other things, when I went to see my brother, who was a sculptor in Toronto."

That was fifty-four years ago. Dunbar's brother, Frederick, took him to the Government Art School. The term was nearly over, but nine weeks remained, and those nine weeks Dunbar not only had two drawings in the exhibition of over 300 students who had been there not less than two years, but took second prize from them all.

He began to help his brother cut marble busts. One of Sir John A. Macdonald, Premier of Canada at that time, was the first he did. Another was that of the Bishop of St. James Cathedral, Toronto.
