MAYOR'S REPORT

During the past year no change has been made either in the personnel or strength of the Force which consists of a Chief, two Sergeants and six Constables. This continues adequate to maintain Law and Order within the City limits. A total of eighty hundred and thirty five Prosecutions were entered and disposed of in the City Police Court, this being a decrease of fifty six cases over the previous year. There has been very little Crime of a serious nature, and this consisted of one case of attempted Rape, one of Robbery with Violence and seven of Breaking and Entering. In every instance the offender was promptly arrested and convicted with one exception, this being the case of Robbery with violence where the offender, after being committed to the Queens County Jail to await trial at the Supreme Court, escaped from custody. He was, however, later arrested in Halifax, N. S., on a charge of Shop-breaking, for which he is now serving a term of one year imprisonment. There were 317 cases of Drunkenness, an increase of 17, but for the offence of operating or having charge of a motor vehicle while intoxicated there were only fourteen cases compared with thirty four during the year 1928.

SCHOOL BOARD

The report of the School Board showed 2019 pupils enrolled with 531 at Prince Street, 471 at West Kent, 560 at Queen Square, and 449 at Rochoff Square. Fifteen teachers are employed at each of Prince Street and Queen Square Schools, fourteen at West Kent, eleven at Rochoff Square and two super-numerary teachers.

During 1929 the boys' lavatory at Prince Street School was remodelled. The new heating system at West Kent is giving satisfaction. The resignation of Mr. L. W. Shaw in June from the position of Supervisor made the employment of two supernumerary schools.

The meat and milk report presented by Dr. T. E. Croken and the report of the police committee by Councillor Holman published elsewhere in The Guardian, were subject to much favourable comment. Councillor Holman advocated an improvement in police cells which should have concrete floors, be well drained and sanitary.

A resolution was moved by Councillor Prowse and seconded by Councillor Kennedy that an appeal be entered against the judgment in the case of Lewis P. Tanton vs. the City of Charlottetown.

The Market Committee under the Chairmanship of Councillor McDougall has given the utmost satisfaction. The Market Building is in good repair and all services in connection therewith have been commendably performed.

The Fire Department with its customary efficiency did splendid service during the year, and the gratitude of Council and citizens is extended to our gallant fire fighters for their efforts during 1929. Councillor Dougan has capably led this Department.

The extent of the work done by Officer James Bradley is revealed by the monthly reports submitted by him. This work is under the direction of Councillor Reardon of the Health Committee. Mr. Reardon is a useful member of Council and ever attentive to his duties.

Dr. McMillan our Health Officer, and Dr. Croken, Inspector of Meat and Milk, have exercised a close and gratifying inspection of all matters connected with their departments.

During the year the erection of the Harris Memorial Library and Art Gallery was undertaken. The City contributed \$10,000 to the building. As a centre of culture it will be of great value to citizens, and an object of interest to tourists.

The revision and consolidation of the Act of Incorporation and the City By-laws is now under way. Quite a number of the By-laws have become obsolete, and in other instances there is overlapping. This is a very necessary step as almost a quarter of a century has elapsed since the last revision.

During the year Charlottetown has been the scene of a number of important conventions, while tourists in increasing numbers have visited us. The construction of the new Canadian National Hotel will do much to increase our accommodation in this respect.

City Clerk Nicholson and his assistants have been faithful, diligent and courteous in the performance of their duties.

To the Members of the Council, and to all Civic Officials I wish to extend my sincere thanks for their assistance, co-operation and faithfulness to duty during the past year.
