Subsequently she was among the first to join the University Volunteer Missionary Movement, but never took up active service. Miss Gardner travelled considerably, and was among the first Canadian ladies to receive a Colonial Office appointment under the Government of Egypt as an instructor in the Normal Training College for teachers in Cairo. Miss Gardner spent two seasons in Egypt, but the climate was too trying and undermined her health. Miss Gardner visited Charlottetown on several occasions and made many friends here who will regret her early demise.

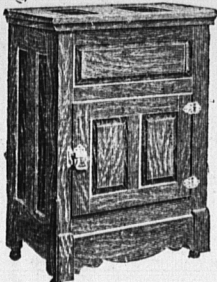
