TO ORGANIZE CHORAL SOCIETY—A meeting will be held in the Kindergarten Music Studio tonight at 7.30 for the purpose of establishing a choral society in this city. For some time this movement has been discussed, and at a meeting last week of representatives of the various church choirs it was decided to call a meeting tonight as well as of persons interested in the development of music in Charlottetown. There is every indication of a successful organization at the gathering this evening. The necessity of such a musical society is widely recognized, and a large attendance is anticipated.

P. E. I. GEESSE IN TRANSIT.—The St. John Telegram of Saturday says:—A big shipment of honkers passed through the city yesterday for Boston. There were four hundred live geese in one car, and during the shunting the disturbance of the equilibrium of the fowl caused them to set up a great clatter, a dozen lusty ganders leading in the chorus. The geese were shipped from P. E. Island. Whenever cars of live geese are attached to a train a knowing conductor will have the car set well in the middle of the train, as if the birds are near the van their honking jars on the nerves of the trainmen.

BAD FIRE AT CAVENDISH.—A bad fire occurred at Cavendish at 2 o'clock on the morning of the 6th inst when the residence of Mr. Harold Simpson a returned soldier was consumed, together with his granary and pig-house, also one horse, a cow, several calves, all his farm machinery, waggons harness and other articles of value. Only by the strenuous efforts of the neighbors was Mr. Simpson's home saved from destruction. Mr. Simpson it is regrettable to state, was himself burned considerably about the face, arms and shoulders while endeavoring to rescue a horse from the stable. There is a prevalent idea that the fire was the work of an incendiary and the authorities have the matter in hand. Much sympathy is felt for Mr. Simpson in his heavy loss there being only a small insurance. He is a young man who served overseas as a signaller with No. 28 Signal Battery under Colonel Frowse.

STEAMER FLOATED.—The steamer Clare Hugo Stinnes L., which went ashore two miles off Cape John, Pictou Co., N. S., a week ago, has been floated. After the steamer was taken off the shoal she rested on another shoal, with the result that the start for Pictou was delayed a day. Frederick Porter of the Atlantic Salvage Co., superintended the salvage operations. She may be brought to Halifax for examination and repairs.
