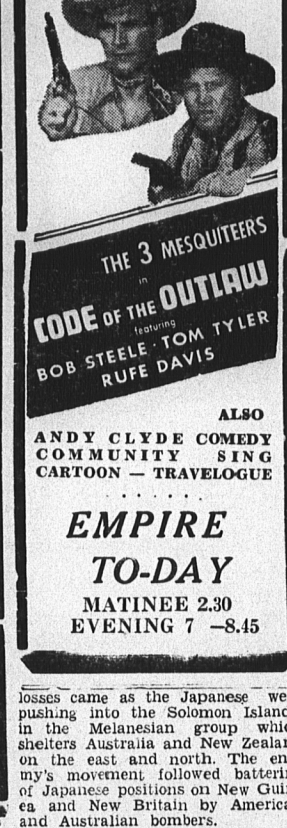

72 Canadians Are Interned By Japanese (Continued from page 1) He expressed the opinion that Russia, as long as she is engaged in the war with Germany, would not move against Japan unless she is 'actually attacked or thought she was going to be attacked.' Gen. Wavell said that 'every effort' is being made to establish new communication lines with the British forces in Burma which in a large measure were cut off from India's arsenals through the loss of Rangoon. Japanese occupation of the chief Burmese seaport and with it of a large part of lower Burma, he acknowledged, is a blow more grave, in some respects, than the fall of Singapore. 'It brings the war much closer to India,' he declared, 'and threatens our communications with our Chinese ally.' But the British commander said a more 'immediate danger' than the expected direct assault on India is a probable Japanese attempt to drive into upper Burma 'to cut the link with China and obtain bases from which India may be attacked or threatened.' He promised any such enemy effort would be combatted 'to the utmost of our resources'.
