**Channel Casualty Returns Home**



**SEAMAN WILLIAM C. MURPHY**

Halifax - Wounded by shrapnel in a night surface battle with German ships off the enemy-held French coast a few weeks after D-day, Able Seaman William C. Murphy, R.C.N.V.R., of Charlottetown, has arrived in Halifax by hospital ship, leaving forward to his first Christmas at home since 1939.

Murphy was a gunner aboard the Canadian destroyer H. M. C. S. Saskatchewan, in a force patrolling along the French coast. Just after midnight July 5 the destroyers encountered four German minesweepers in the running three-hour battle that followed three of the enemy ships were sunk and the fourth scuttled into Stret Harbour.

German shells killed one man and wounded eight aboard Saskatchewan. Murphy, with a jagged shrapnel slash below his left knee which severed nerves and muscles, spent the months since the action in five hospitals in the United Kingdom.

Back in Canada for the first time in two and a half years, he is expected to get home to Charlottetown to see his mother and his brother, A. B. Jack Murphy, now on leave from another Canadian ship. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. John Murphy, 313 Craton Street, Charlottetown.
