SOME REASONS FOR THE LIBERAL DEFEAT.

The crushing defeat sustained by the Liberal candidates in the bye-elections of Wednesday last may be said to be largely due to the following among other causes: The defeat of the Laurier Government, on which the Provincial Government had long leaned rather helplessly for support; the failure from confessed inability to restore the equilibrium between revenue and expenditure; the failure to give our educational system modern efficiency; the lack of a progressive policy except in regard to bridges and public buildings; the practical abandonment of our claims against the Dominion; a supercilious and contemptuous attitude toward and treatment of political opponents and independents.

The electorate of Prince Edward Island has long been divided between the two political parties in nearly equal numbers, with an ever increasing number of independents who refuse to be dragged by party leaders on either side. This independent body will now have an exponent in the Legislature in the person of Professor MacPhail, and we doubt not that the number of independents may be increased when a general election comes round, but that by the way. A political party can only gain strength by winning to its side electors from the opposite party or from among the independents.

It was just here that the Premier failed, not from lack of courtesy on his part, but from the violent and often grossly insulting language of his principal newspaper organ. All who ventured to differ from it or show any measure of independence were unsparingly denounced as "Tories." This word, originally applied to a band of outlaws who haunted the bogs of Ireland, was used by The Patriot newspaper, sometimes ten or twelve times in a single issue, in the most offensive way, and applied to the Conservatives past and present. We fail to see why the Liberal-Conservative party, or the Conservative party, as it is shortly called, is not as fairly entitled to be called by its proper name.

The Conservative party has no need to be ashamed of the men it has produced in Prince Edward Island. Hon. Senator McDonald, one of the Fathers of Confederation, Chief Justice Sullivan, and other eminent judges past and present, the late Senator Ferguson, the late Hon. Daniel Don, Mr. Mathieson who is admittedly one of the ablest public men in Eastern Canada today, would seem to be entitled to some respect in the Liberal press as they are and have been given by the people among whom they lived. These and all who supported them have been almost every day stigmatised by a contemptuous nickname in the columns of The Patriot. Surely this was not a promising way to win support from the Conservative side.

The independents were treated even more contemptuously by the Liberal organ. They were sneered at as hypocrites and pretenders. The Guardian, which speaks for a goodly number of the electors who think for themselves, has been from time to time stigmatised by The Patriot as a Tory organ, a Judas Iscariot, a traitor, "a vulture within the gates," whatever that may mean, a pirate, and so on. We make no complaint of this. It did not harm The Guardian or its editor a particle, but it did harm to the man who penned these epithets, harm to the Liberal party and it offended against the dignity and decency of journalism. It certainly did not prove very effectual in winning independent voters to support the Liberal party in its hour of need.

Hon. Messrs. Palmer, Cumiskey and Richards with their colleagues in the Government, themselves disposed to be courteous, were badly served by their newspaper organ in its campaign of epithets, and some part, we will not say how much, of the crushing defeat the party has now suffered is due to that organ's capacity for making enemies rather than for making friends. We look for amendment in the future after the lesson which the electors have imparted. Civility and courtesy are necessary and desirable in political as in social life, and hardly less desirable in press discussion.

THE ROYAL TOUR

The departure of the King and Queen on a three months visit to India is a notable event in the history of the Indian Empire. Although the prices of royal blood, and upon occasion the Heir Apparent, have seen India, this is the first occasion on which the reigning Sovereign has in person received the homage of his Indian subjects in their own land.

King, George, as he is known in the United Kingdom and in the British Dominions beyond the seas generally, is Emperor of India, and the royal visit and progress there will be surrounded with imposing pomp such as will appeal to the oriental imagination. All will join in the hope that the great Durbar with the outward and returning voyage may be free from harm or peril to the royal visitors. And when this has been successfully accomplished, may we not indulge in the hope that Their Majesties will not long delay making a visit to Canada?

RECENT FLYING RECORDS.

Progress in human flight has been shown within the past few weeks by the remarkable achievements of G.P. Rodgers in America and Charles Weyman in Europe. Rodgers broke all long distance records by his flight across the North American continent from Sheeps Head Bay on the Atlantic to Pasadena, California. He was really 48 days on the way, owing to frequent serious accidents, including a break-down high in the air when he was almost at his journey's end near Pasadena. But he made the total distance of 4,141 miles in 4846 minutes of actual flight, an average of about 51 miles an hour.

Weyman made the trip from Rheims northwesterly to Amiens in France, travelling a distance of 186 miles in two hours and thirty-four minutes, or at the rate of 72 miles an hour, and carried a passenger with him and without alighting by the way. This was a record for speed over a long distance.

Another notable achievement is that of Wilbur Wright recently made in soaring aloft in a forty mile gale and remaining poised in the air without the use of any motive power save that supplied by the wind. So far

general election was held on January 30, 1890 which resulted in the return of 15 Conservatives and 15 Liberals. The Government was not in a minority until some bye-elections were held, resulting from the resignation of John McLean, Hon. D. Ferguson, Patrick Blake and Hon. D. Ferguson to become candidates for the Commons. The four bye-elections were held on April 9 and resulted in the returning of one Conservative and three Liberals, thus giving the Opposition a majority of two.
