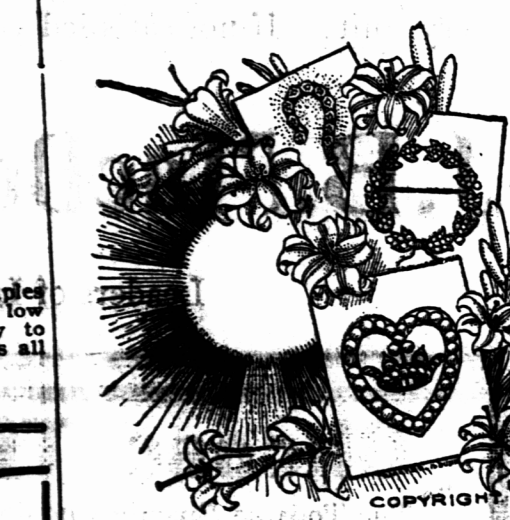

## PROPOSED NEW METHOD OF TAXATION IN ONTARIO

Some Novel Features of a Bill Now Before the Ontario Legislature—The Five Classifications Worked Out as They Would Operate in Actual Practice

The Toronto Globe says: The Ontario assessment committee, which is now before a special committee of the Legislature, there are five classes of taxation—that on realty, that on income, that on public utilities, and the house tax and the business tax. So complete are the contemplated changes from the present system in other respects of experts are not quite clear as to the actual working out of the proposed act. With a view to illustrating the new system, the following concrete examples are given, with some introductory explanations.

**PERSONALTY TAXATION ABOLISHED.**  
By the proposed measure taxation of personalty is now understood as applicable in place of it is substituted a business tax based upon the rental value of the property owned. The measure of the property franchise, apart from the rental value of the property, is an entirely new departure. The taxation of income is placed upon an altogether new basis, and is divided into the taxation of income in a house, a house tax, levied on all residents in houses as net at \$3,500 or all residents in houses as net at \$3,500 or all residents in houses as net at \$3,500 or all residents in houses as net at \$3,500.

**THE BUSINESS TAX.**  
The business tax is simple enough. Suppose the value put upon a property to be \$100,000. The annual value for the purposes of the new assessment measure is computed at 7 per cent, and is therefore \$7,000. The business tax is 7-1/2 per cent, of that, or \$525. The municipality has the power to raise the rate of taxation to ten per cent of the annual value, which in this case would amount to \$700.

**THE INCOME TAX.**  
The income tax is a more complicated problem, since there are three or more classes of assessment in addition to the house tax. The income exemption is increased from \$700 to \$1,000, and the rate of taxation, not the ordinary municipal rate, as determined year by year, but a fixed rate of five mills, or one-half of one per cent. If a person drawing a salary of \$2,000, \$1,000 is exempt, and of the other \$1,000 the tax would be \$5. Under the present law he would pay in Toronto this year 10 mills on \$1,800, or \$32.70. But there is the house tax. Suppose he lives in a house worth \$4,000, the annual value at 7 per cent is \$280, but it is exempt to the extent of \$350, or an annual value of \$245 leaving \$35 on which to levy one-half of one per cent, or \$1.70.

**THE PROFESSIONAL TAX.**  
In the case of a professional man with an income from his profession over \$1,000, and not over \$4,000, he is taxed at the rate of 7-1/2 per cent upon the annual value of the premises occupied for the purpose of his work; for income in excess of \$4,000 he is taxed directly at the income rate of one-half of one per cent. Suppose a professional man to be receiving from his professional work \$5,000 a year. His income has an annual value of \$350, and 7-1/2 per cent, or that is \$26.25. On his income over \$4,000, in this case \$1,000, he pays one-half of one per cent, \$5. Then, suppose he lives in a house worth \$5,000 allowing the exemption of \$3,500 he would pay a further tax of \$7.57. If he own the house he will have to pay also the ordinary municipal rate of taxation upon the assessed value of it.

Then there is the income derived from investments. If the rate payer has not benefited by the \$1,000 exemption in one of the classes already cited, that exemption is allowed; if he has, it is not, and the taxes are computed at the rate of one-half of one per cent on the income in question.

**THE HOUSE TAX.**  
The house tax, which in no way interferes with the ordinary assessment of property as realty, is intended to supplement the income tax, and in Toronto is levied only on residents of houses valued at more than \$3,500, or an annual value of \$245. It places with not more people than 175,000, the exemption is an annual value of \$175, and graded down, according to population. The rate of taxation is 5 per cent on the annual value over and above the exemption stated.

**THE FRANCHISE TAX.**  
The franchise tax is subject to be dealt with by the proposed Provincial Assessment Commission. One method put forward by experts of arriving at a valuation of a public franchise, such as the Toronto Railway Co. enjoys, is to deduct from the market value of all the stock the cost of plant, etc. The market value of the stock of the Toronto Railway Co. is \$4,000,000. The cost of installing the plant was probably \$2,000,000. In the neighborhood of \$2,000,000 leaving \$2,000,000 as the value of the franchise. In the case of steam railways any increase in assessment by the commission is to take effect at the rate of 10 per cent a year. In the case of a franchise extending over more than one municipality, the commission is to allot the taxation to which the municipalities are entitled. As to what the effect of the new measure should it become law, would have upon the total receipts of the city of Toronto from taxation it is almost impossible to even estimate at present.
