Demand For N. Y. Stocks Eases After Five Days

NEW YORK, May 17 (CP) - The stock market ran out of buying power today after a five-day running advance.

Declines of fractions to around a point were in a clear-cut majority at the final bell.

Trading volume contracted to 800,000 shares from yesterday's 1,030,000.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dipped .2 of one point to 63.8, the first setback since May 10. The industrial group showed the largest loss, followed by rail-road stocks.

Of the 988 individual issues which sold, 403 declined and 236 advanced.

Electric Power and Light Common and Commonwealth and Southern were among the shares which fell back after establishing new 1949 highs yesterday. E.P.L. finished 1-8 lower at 26 while C & S lost the same amount at 3 7-8.

The Associated Press average of 15 utility shares remained at 40.5, only a shade away from the 1949 top of 40.7.

Closing lower were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem Steel, Inland Steel, Chrysler, Studebaker, Montgomery Ward, J. I. Case, American Smelting, Phelps Dodge, American Can General Electric and Dow Chemical.

POTATO GROWERS ATTENTION

The attention of potato growers on Prince Edward Island is drawn to the provisions of an Act to constitute the Province of Prince Edward Island a Certified Seed Area for the Production of Potatoes. Sections 2, 3, 4, and 5, of this Act read as follows: 2. From and after the passing of this Act, no person shall plant potatoes in the Province of Prince Edward Island unless the seed used is of the class Foundation "A", or Certified, as determined by the official inspections carried out by the Plant Protection Division, Science Service, Dominion Department of Agriculture. Provided, however, that this section shall not apply to potato crops which, in the aggregate, on an individual property, do not exceed one acre, unless by proclamation of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council otherwise. 3. All potato crops as covered by Section 2 hereof shall be subject to inspection as follows: (a) Subject to conformity with the regulations governing the production of certified seed potatoes, crops planted with Foundation or Certified "A" seed with a view to seed certification, may be inspected by the Plant Protection Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture. (b) Potato Crops including those planted with seed of the "Certified" class with a view to table stock production shall be inspected for bacterial ring rot, or any other disease or insect pest as may be determined from time to time, by duly authorized inspectors of the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture. 4. Each potato grower, as covered by Section 2 hereof, shall be required to register each field of potatoes for inspection as follows: (a) If for seed potato production, applications shall be submitted to the District Seed Potato Inspector, Dominion Department of Agriculture, Charlottetown. (b) If for table stock production, application shall be submitted to the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture. 5. In accordance with the Certified Seed Potato Regulations each grower who applies for inspection of his crop for seed purposes shall be required, among other qualifications, to supply proof of the planting of seed of the Foundation or Foundation "A" class in the field for which inspection is requested. All other growers shall be required to supply proof of the purchase of certified seed used for planting the potato crop. In view of the fact that seed supplies are being cleaned up in various parts of the Province, potato growers are urged to secure the necessary requirements of Certified, Foundation, or Foundation "A" as the case may be, before the supply is completely exhausted.
