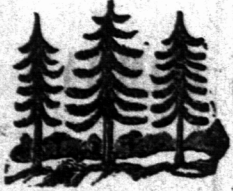

PROHIBITION.

Amid all the turmoil of party strife in the Legislature, there is about the city and country a strong body of honest, earnest, expectant citizens who are waiting to see what the Assembly will do in regard to Provincial Prohibition. These citizens are looking to the Government of the day, and the temperance men in the Opposition ranks to deal with this matter. The question cannot be blinked or ignored or set aside except of a deliberate purpose. It is calling with trumpet voice for consideration. There can be no question as to the wishes of the people. It is admitted that the majority of the people desire Prohibition and condemn the License Law. The various temperance bodies, church courts, conferences and associations have recorded their resolutions, deputation have waited upon the Government, have been favorably received and a Bill has been prepared, embodying as we believe, the wishes of the great majority of the people of the Island.

Now what is to be done about it? The Bill has not yet been introduced. In our parliamentary practice such a measure can only be introduced with the sanction of the Executive. Primarily, therefore the responsibility for action rests with the Government of the day. They must choose whether they will adhere to the principle of License or decide for Prohibition. And the decision ought to be promptly made. That decision will be made in the face of the facts as they exist—the rampant drunkenness that prevails under License in this city—from day to day, week-day and Sunday, the well-understood wishes of the people in favor of Prohibition, the fact that Manitoba is already legislating along the Prohibition line. The Government know full well what is the attitude of the temperance community and of the temperance press toward the existing law, and what their future attitude must be. Under these circumstances a determination to refuse Prohibition and to stand by the principle of License would be a determination to set the Prohibition sentiment of the country at defiance.

This conviction would be accentuated by the fact that the hopes of the temperance people have been raised by the attitude of the Premier, and of the Patriot newspaper, (the organ of the Government) during the past few weeks. The temperance people are still in an attitude of hope and expectancy, not unmixed with impatience. We trust they may not be disappointed. But the time has come when the strain of suspense ought to be relieved. At this stage of the session there ought to be no longer any uncertainty as to whether a measure of such vast importance will or will not be forthcoming.

A FOOLISH RUMOR.

Lord Strathcona Not Likely to Re-enter Politics.

One who is close to Lord Strathcona laughed at the rumor which has gained circulation in the Toronto press to the effect that his lordship intended re-entering politics at the next general elections—the noble High Commissioner running in the Liberal interest in St. Antoine division against Dr. Roddick, with the understanding that he would be made Minister of Trade and Commerce in the new Liberal cabinet.

"Nothing could be more ridiculous," said the gentleman in question. "In the first place, Lord Strathcona has no thought of coming out to this country for some time; in the second place, he has no thought, or

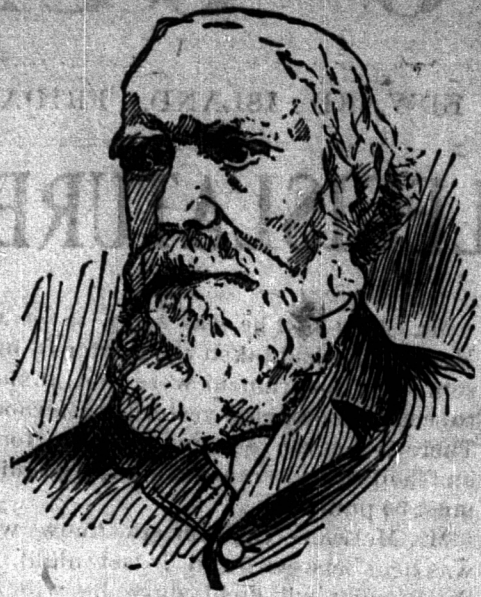

desire, or intention of re-entering politics; in the third place, Lord Strathcona is a Liberal-Conservative—not, indeed, an extreme party man, but certainly not a Liberal as Liberalism is expounded by the party in power. There need be no credence placed upon the rumor, which is all the more ridiculous in that it fathers His Lordship with the intention of attacking the seat of Dr. Roddick. Why, it was upon the urgent desire of His Lordship that Dr. Roddick consented to come forward, for the genial doctor had no hankering after politics. It was known that he was popular, and that if he came out he could carry the seat upon personal rather than political grounds.

Lord Strathcona has repeatedly deprecated extreme party bias, both in public and private, saying that the chief thing was to be able to serve one's country without regard to party distinctions. By that His Lordship did not mean that he was destitute of political opinions. He always desired to show, simply, that he was the best citizen who made as little as possible of party distinctions, and who exercised his judgement in regard to all the great questions which came before the country.

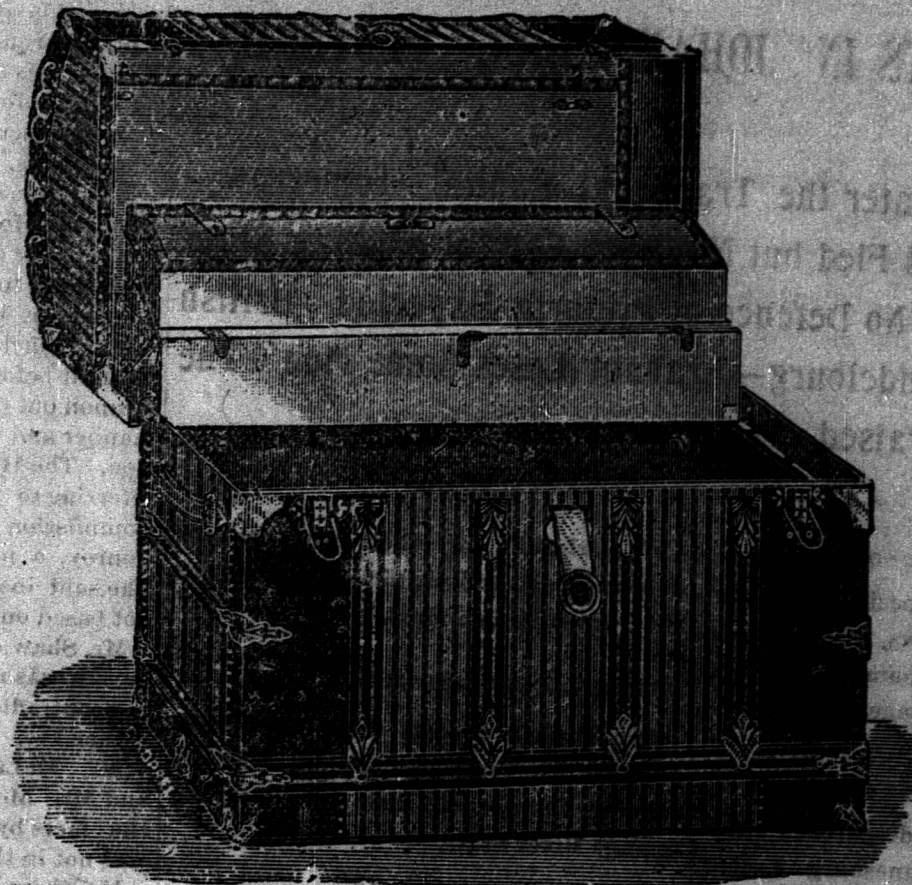

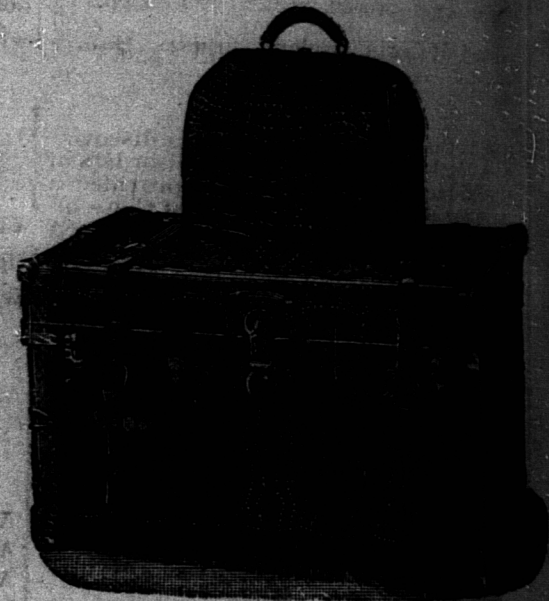

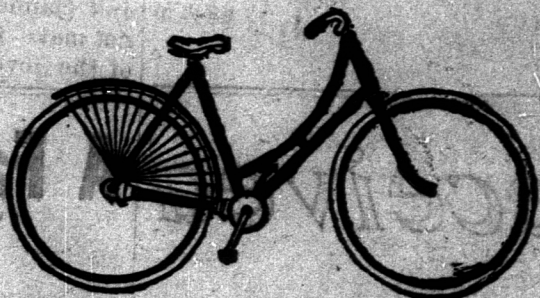
