NO MORE DREADNOUGHTS

Small Heavily Armed Ships Much Better

The navies of the world have built 101 battleships of the dreadnought type since the British navy launched the original dreadnought. The passing of the century mark came with the launching of the British battle-cruiser Tiger, and with that the decision of the British naval authorities to build no more warships of just that type. It has been reported that the smaller vessel more heavily armed will be the fashion during the next season of British naval designing. The building of 101 dreadnoughts in eight years means that an average of more than one of these mammoth ships a month has been launched.

BETTER THAN BRIDGE

Mr. Selfridge Speaks on Business as a Game

"To me business is one of the most attractive possible games in the world," said Mr. Gordon Selfridge in the course of a lecture at the Jewish Institute, London. "I urge as much as I can," he continued, "that the work of the day shall be made a game rather than a drudgery. It is a jolly, good, lively game. It beats bridge and golf and polo."

After a two years' retirement from business in America he found that he was the most unhappy man in the world, Mr. Selfridge declared. So he came to London in order to play the game again. That was his excuse for coming so far away from the place where he was born. The charm of business was the competition; competition, in fact, was really the "spice" of the thing.

In order to make a reasonable success in commerce certain things were absolutely necessary. The foundation of a successful business, no matter what the business was, was integrity. Dishonesty did not pay in the long run. A man with determination and strength of purpose could go a long way towards success. If a man was not lazy—and laziness was a frightful falling—and played the game of business for the love of it, and had nerve, courage and imagination, he was certain to forge ahead.

Mr. Selfridge concluded by recommending South America to young men who felt that they could not get to the top in London. "South America," he said, "is going to be a great factor in the commercial world in the near future."

HUMAN FAILURES

An Expert Says Men Quit at Thirty-five

Thirty-five, according to experts, is the age when most men who have been losing their grip upon life give up the struggle and become derelicts. Charles B. Barnes, special investigator for a number of charitable institutions, when asked for his opinion on this subject said:

"Yes, 35 seems to be the deciding age for men of the class with whom I am dealing. Up to that age these men try to keep up a good appearance, but at 35 they commence to sag. There are no born derelicts, but more than half of the homeless men are naturally feeble minded. This, together with the influences which have been at work throughout their early life, has made them what they are. At 35 life becomes a serious proposition to them. Their natural disabilities and many failures begin to crush them. Then comes the final collapse—the mental and moral breakdown."

PROPHECY FULFILLED

Preparing to Cultivate the Garden of Eden

Wherever the original Garden of Eden was situated the traditional first residence of man on earth is what is now the south-eastern part of Turkey in Asia in the region around the Euphrates and Tigris rivers—a land once studded with many great cities, later covered with a continuous forest of verdure, but for centuries an uninhabitable desert of salt marshes, bare plains and sand drifts. Such transformation has the Garden seen, where, according to the author of Genesis, "The Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food." And now despatches report still another change, whereby Eden's original fertility is to be restored through a vast irrigation system that will cost \$115,000,000 and reclaim 3,000,000 acres of the finest agricultural land in the world. Part of the system has already been completed.

Isaiah's prediction that "the desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose" is about to come true, for the yield of wheat and cotton along the Euphrates and the Tigris is expected to return rich dividends on the cost of irrigation.

And evening full of the linnet's wings.

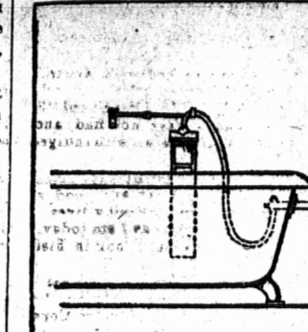
I will rise and go now, for always night and day

PHOTO FILM WASHER

Hose Connects With Spigot of Bath-tub and Sprays Strip

For the convenient handling of photographic films at home a photographer has invented a film washer. This consists of a rubber tube that connects with the spigot of the bath tub as a bath spray does and has a slot attachment on the other end. This attachment consists of two flat lips that work on the same principle as a paper clip. They hold one end of the film and the hose is then hung

over a gas bracket or towel rack or some similar object so that it is some distance above the tub and the film can dangle its full length below. The water is then turned on and is sprayed gently over the film, washing it thoroughly and without the finger touching it anywhere. Any spigot in the house will do quite as well, but a bucket should be provided over which the film can be hung.
