### NOTTINGHAM, England (CP)

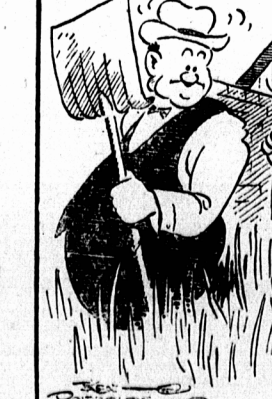
