To Be Held on Wednesday Afternoon At the Abegweit Athletic Grounds. The Finest Meet Ever Put On By the Local Club Management Is Assured. Forty Eight Athletes In All Will Start In the Different Events. Including Such Crack Athletes As Barney Francis, Mooney, Lapierre, Gorman, Miller, McAuley, G. Francis, P. McDonald, All Champions and Many others. Dance at Casino Wednesday Night in Honor of Visiting Athletes, Given By Abegweit Athletic Club.

No athletic meet in the history of Prince Edward Island has created as much interest and enthusiasm as the coming Maritime Athletic Meet to be held Wednesday afternoon at the Abegweit Athletic Grounds.

The announcement that Miss Winnifred Blair of St. John, N. B., "Miss Canada," has been cordially invited by the Abegweit management to grace the occasion with her presence, is creating more than ordinary interest, and should this distinguished and popular young lady consent to favor Charlottetown by accepting the local club's invitation, this in itself, together with the big Maritime Athletic Meet will make Wednesday a day long to be remembered.

While all competitors are of high-class calibre, Charlottetown spectators will be privileged to witness in action some particularly notable athletes. Among these shining stars are Mooney, representing the Halifax Crescents, and the University of Pennsylvania, who competes in the quarter and half mile runs, in the latter of which he has an international name; Erin Smith, a fellow clubman and a remarkable sprinter; McAuley, of the Halifax Wanderers, a noted distance runner who in April last made a sensational finish in the famous Boston Marathon; Miller, the Canadian high-jump champion, seeking a new record; Lapierre, a sterling mile performer; Gorman, who holds the Maritime sprint honors, and is also the world's quarter mile skating champion; Phil. McDonald, the Maritime champion of the broad jump; Barney Francis, the fleet Indian runner.
