THE SYSTEM IS BAD.

For years the system of administering federal affairs in this Province has been about as bad as can be. We refer particularly to the three closely related and important services of railways, marine and the mail service. These services are interlocked or subsidiary to each other in various ways. In the winter season, especially, a passenger or from the island or a shipper of freight either way must utilize the Government Railways and the government steamers. The mails can only go or come by the same two-fold conveyances. It is sufficiently obvious from this that the three services to be efficient must work together with the regularity of clock-work.

And so they might, if there were unity of control and a general disposition among those who have control to work together. Instead of this we have perpetual friction and playing at cross purposes, endless delays and disappointments, indignant telegrams to Ottawa and tardy responses, with frequent engagements, one of which is no sooner straightened out than another is presented. The result is constant dissatisfaction among the people with the management of one or other of these services and with the officials and the Government.

Beyond question the existing system makes the duties of the Railway Superintendent, the Agent of the Marine Department and the Post Office Inspector very difficult to handle. Their powers are limited and circumscribed sometimes by cramping orders and instructions, and often by the fact that the Ottawa departments to whom everything must be referred, cannot agree between themselves, or cannot come to an agreement in reasonable time. The tendency of such an incongruous system is to make the official heads mere cogs in a wheel of routine, without initiative and only acting when and as they are directed by the triumvirate of departments at Ottawa.

The obvious remedy is to have some one authority localised here that can act with full control and with full knowledge of what is required. Had we such an authority here it would greatly simplify the operation of the three interrelated services and tend to their efficiency. All those matters of conflict with regard to the date when the winter steamers shall begin their work, the ports to which they should ply, the hours of sailing, the time of transferring the steamer from Charlottetown to Georgetown and vice versa, the matter of mail and passenger trains to connect with the steamer, ought to be settled here promptly and by competent authority on the spot.

Painful experience in the past and especially more recently has demonstrated the urgent necessity of a change in this direction. If authority were thus centralized in competent hands we should not have the unseemly spectacle of two departments squabbling over the matter of a special train to carry lifeboats to the shore to save drowning men. It is perhaps natural that under existing conditions there should arise some party clamor for the removal of certain officials. This clamor is, however, by no means purely disinterested or inspired by a noble minded desire for a better service. There are, as there always have been men who would depose officials to get their place.

With such motives neither we nor a disinterested public can have any sympathy.

NEWS FROM MR. HYMAN.

Our Ottawa despatches of Saturday were somewhat amusing in regard to Hon. Mr. Hyman. They announce that the Minister of Public Works has not resigned his seat and is not likely to do so; that he had been ill awhile ago and it seemed he would have to resign on account of illness, but that he is better now; that he certainly will not resign until the inquiry now going on in Toronto regarding the London election scandal is finished and that if he resigns then it will be for the purpose of again seeking election in London.

The general public will be glad to hear from Mr. Hyman, who had been rather reticent of late; they will be sorry to learn for the first time of his illness and glad to learn that he is better; surprised that the investigation of election rascality should have had a recuperative effect upon him; they will hope that he will yet resign when the conspiracy inquiry is over and that he may again be a candidate before the London election, and they will most sincerely desire that the next election there may be very unlike the last in several important respects.

The Patriot with plentiful blame for Superintendent Sharp and Marine Agent Lord is careful to say that it "does not blame the Government." In connection with the regrettable failure of the federal departments here to render aid to the shipwrecked sailors. But it is obvious that the Government is responsible for the acts of its subordinates until and except the action of such subordinates is disclaimed or reversed. And the Government is always responsible for the general system or want of system under which public affairs are carried on. It looks as though the vigor of The Patriot's attack upon the two officials was inspired by an ardent desire to shield the Government under circumstances that are somewhat awkward, to say the least.

GOOD PROGRESS ON G.T. PACIFIC

MONTREAL, Nov. 8.—At the adjourned annual meeting of the directors and shareholders of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company held today, the following directors were elected: Sir C. Rivers Wilson, G. C. M. G. C. B.; Alfred W. Smither, Hon. N. Ch. R. Rothschild, Sir Henry Mathen Jackson, Bart., and Colonel Frederick Firebrace, R. E. London, Esq.; Chas. H. Hays, Frank W. Morse, Wm. H. Elgar, Montreal; Hon. Geo. A. Cox, E. H. Wood, Toronto; J. R. Booth, Ottawa. Mr. Alfred Brunet, who has been appointed by the Government as its representative on the Board of directors of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company, attended the meeting and took his seat on the board. Good progress was reported in connection with the construction work now in hand, the only difficulty being the scarcity of labor.
