The American destroyer is the finest thing afloat. It can make 40 miles an hour---that is, the best ones can---and it can turn around on a nickel. It is armed almost as heavily as an old-time cruiser and when it is going head on toward a "driver," the latter has just as much chance of hitting it with a torpedo as it would have of hitting the sharp edge of a razor blade. The submarines have already learned to their sorrow that it doesn't pay to exchange blows with the little American gentleman of the sea and that the only thing to do when he is sighted is to submerge as quickly and deeply as possible. And even then, the little fellow is likely to blow the "sub" out of the water with a depth bomb if he gets a good glance at it before it dives.

#### YES, HOW WOULD HE?

The St. John, N.B., Globe, one of the staunchest Liberal papers of the Maritime Provinces in a recent editorial declared:

"Every man in Canada today knows where Sir Robert Borden stands on conscription. Does any man know where Sir Wilfrid Laurier stands? There was a referendum on this great question, which is bigger than party politics, how would he ask the people to vote?"

#### SIR WILFRID'S POSITION

If Sir Wilfrid Laurier refuses to support compulsory military service, what will he support?

Since the war broke out he has made practically no effort to obtain recruits; his promise to "stump Quebec," if ever the Empire were in peril, remains unfulfilled.

When he was asked to join the National Service in an appeal for recruits he declined.

It is no inference to say Sir Wilfrid is a man who has not been an enthusiastic supporter of the volunteer system. And if he failed to support voluntarism, and fails to support conscription, what will he support?

#### THE REAL ISSUE

The real issue before the Canadian people in respect to compulsory military service is whether or not we have a limited liability in this war. Those who decline to accept the principle of universal military service are, in the very order of things, taking the position that we have done all that we are called upon to do in this struggle. Can such an attitude be justified in the light of our claim to be an integral part of the British Empire? Can it be justified in view of our professions to be fighting the battles of freedom and civilization, as against despotism and barbarity.

#### LAURIER'S PITIABLE PART

"Tear up your campaign literature," said Joseph Chamberlain to the Unionist party after he returned from South Africa, and raised the banner of tariff reform. The Canadian Conservative party can safely tear up its old campaign literature. Sir Wilfrid Laurier's letter to the Prime Minister on coalition is all that it now requires.

#### LAURIER IS RESPONSIBLE

If Canada has not national unity today it is not the fault of Sir Robert Borden. The Prime Minister carries his countrymen strong in the consciousness that he has striven, as no Canadian politician leader has ever striven before, to close up the ranks of the Canadian people in face of the common foe.

#### NO COLORING MUST BE IN MARGARINE.

OTTAWA, Nov. 18.---Additional regulations to govern the manufacture of oleomargarine in Canada and importation have been issued by the Food Controller. Many applications for licenses have been received and the latter will be issued from the office of the Veterinary Director, General Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, so as to be effective on and after December 10. Persons who desire licenses and who have not already applied should make application at once to the Veterinary Director General's Office.

#### Must Not Use Coloring.

The new regulations require that "No substance intended for the coloring of oleomargarine shall be imported into Canada in packages containing oleomargarine, and no manufacturer, wholesale dealer or retailer, dealing in oleomargarine shall deal in, sell or give away any substance intended for coloring oleomargarine."

Oleomargarine may be sold only in original packages. Each small package must be wrapped separately and on each label or wrapper "oleomargarine" must be printed or marked as the most conspicuous word. The name and address of the manufacturer, together with the official inspection mark of the country or origin, must appear on all labels, wrappers and packages. Labels, stencils, or lithograph designs used as containers for oleomargarine must be approved by the Veterinary Director General. The penalty for violation of any of the regulations is a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500, or imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or both fine and imprisonment.

#### To be Closely Inspected.

Strict provisions are made to ensure official inspection of all materials entering into the composition of oleomargarine. No oleomargarine may be manufactured in Canada except under the supervision of inspectors appointed by the Minister of Agriculture, while imported oleomargarine must be accompanied by the export certificate of Government inspection of the country or origin.

#### THE BRIGHTEST STAR

Sirius which astronomers say is the brightest star, is estimated to be in round numbers, seventy billion miles distant---that is, seventy billion followed by twelve noughts. It is called a fixed star, but it moves about an inch a century. Yet that movement so microscopic as seen from the earth, to be visible at all must represent a movement or speed of 1,900,000 miles a day.

If the sky is clear, look for Sirius tonight, and think that the light by which you see it left the star nearly thirty years ago, yet light travels 186,000 miles a second and takes under eight minutes to pass from sun to earth.

Compared with Sirius the sun is a mere flicker, a candle in an arc light. If the two were to exchange places in the universe the sun would almost pop out of sight altogether, being barely visible to the naked eye, a star of the sixth magnitude. But this earth and all its boasted power and wealth would be shivered up just as a bit of tow in a blast furnace, for Sirius, according to astronomical calculations would fill all the space represented by the orbit of the earth, being equal to four hundred suns.

#### LIGHTNING BREAKS DISH HOLDING STEEL BEADS

During a recent thunderstorm in New York state a certain home by an unusual accident that accompanied a sharp bolt of lightning, says the December Popular Mechanics Magazine, the latter struck very close to the house in question, causing the telephone to "snap" so that those in the room heard it distinctly. Following some steel beads, standing on a table about 12 feet from the telephone, broke into pieces, scattering the beads on the floor. The apparent explanation of the phenomenon is that when the lightning caused the spark at the telephone there was a discharge of electricity into the room and that the beads being of polished steel with numerous sharp edges, offered a path of least resistance to the discharge which, seeking a ground, burst the dish.

#### CLIPPING MACHINE A BOON TO RED CROSS WORKERS

Women in Red Cross groups who have blistered their hands making clippings from cloths with which to fill fracture pillows for our army hospitals will welcome a new machine, described and pictured in the December Popular Mechanics Magazine, that clips about eight times as fast as a person can with a pair of shears. It is provided with four knives, mounted like the spokes of a wheel, which are turned on all axis by means of a handle. As they revolve they pass a stationary blade across which torn strips of the proper width are fed by means of two rollers.
